Marchioness of Lorne, The Duchess of Connaught and Strathearne, with The Princess Margaret of Connaught and The Duchess of Albany, joined the Procession in East Cowes.

On reaching The Prince of Wales's Gate Her Majesty and The Royal Princesses left the Procession, and proceeded by the Upper Road to Whippingham Church.

On arrival at the Church, at 1.45 o'clock, The Queen, with Their Royal Highnesses The Princess of Wales and The Princess Beatrice, Princess Henry of Battenberg, were received at the Lych Gate by The Lord Chamberlain, who conducted Her Majesty and Their Royal Highnesses to The Queen's Pew.

The other Princesses on their arrival at the Church were received by The Vice-Chamberlain, and conducted to The Queen's Pew.

Their Highnesses The Princes Leopold and Maurice and The Princess Victoria Eugénie of Battenberg had previously arrived in The Queen's Pew, attended by Madlle. du Perrut and Mrs. Chapman.

Madame de Arcos, representing Her Majesty The Empress Eugénie, was also placed in The Queen's Pew.

The Viscountess Downe, Lady-in-Waiting, Hon. Evelyn Moore, and Hon. Mary Byng, Maids of Honour, were in Attendance on Her Majesty; Miss Charlotte Knollys, Bedchamber Woman to Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales, Hon. Lady Biddulph and Miss Minnie Cochrane, Ladies in Attendance on Her Royal Highness The Princess Beatrice, Princess Henry of Battenberg, and The Dowager Lady Churchill, and Hon. Harriet Phipps, were likewise seated in The Queen's Yew, where Colonel Hon. H. Byng, C.B., was also in Attendance.

At 12.30, the Coffin was carried from Her Majesty's Yacht "Alberta" to the Gun Carriage by Bluejackets belonging to the Royal Yacht, and the Procession moved off in slow time, in the following order:---
