Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to these Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majerty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," and "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of London, I hereby make the following Orders :-

1. The time during which the taking and killing of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the county of London so as to be from the 1st day of February

to the 31st day of August in each year.
2. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the County of London to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act :-

Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (Hirundo urbica, Hirundo riparia), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie.

3. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the

following species of Wild Birds is prohibited

throughout the County of London:

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Larks (Alauda arvensis, Alauda arborea), Nightjar, Woodpeckers (Gecinus viridis, Picus major, Picus minor), Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls (Asio otus, Strix-flammen, Syrnium aluco), Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (Hirundo urbica, Hirundo riparia), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasint), Shrikes (Lanius colluria, Lanius minor, Lanius excubitor), Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Redstart, Flycatchers (Muscicapa grisala, Muscicapa atricapilla), Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Wood War-bler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Whitethroat, bler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Longtailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wagtails (Motacilla viridis, Motacilla lugubris, Motacilla melanope, Motacilla rari), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (Emberiza rustica, Emberiza melanocephala, Emberiza citrinella), Starling, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot.

1. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1889," shall apply within the Administrative County of Bedford to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were

included in the Schedule to the Act :-

Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Shrike or Butcher Bird, Wheatear, Nuthatch, Wryneck or Cuckoo's Mate.

2. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited

throughout the County of Bedford:-

Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Owl, Nightingale, Nuthatch, Goldfinch, Swift, Nightjar (Goatsucker or Fern Owl), Kingfisher, Woodpecker, Wryneck or Cuckoo's Mate.

The time during which the taking and killing of Wild Birds is prohibited shall be extended within the county of Bedford so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 12th day of August in each year, and, so far as regards the kingfisher this time shall be further extended so as to be from the 1st day of February to the 31st day

of August in each year.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order. Out-door Labour Test:—

Saint Alban's Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Saint
Alban's Union;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union;— And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Saint Alban's Union, as follows:—

ARTICLE 1. Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles

of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such ablebodied pappers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should

be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of such an officer.
