HEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, between Her Majesty and the President of the French Republic, amending Articles seven and nine of the Extradition Treaty of the fourteenth August, one thousand eight hundred seventy-six, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms

following:

"Hen Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and the President of the French Republic, being desirous to render more efficacious the provisions of Articles VII and IX of the Treaty between Great Britain and France of the 14th August,

"SA Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, Impératrice des Indes, et le Président de la République Française, désireux de rendre plus efficaces les dispositions des Articles VII et IX du Traité conclu le 14 Août, 1876, entre la Grande-Bretagne et la 1876, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, have named as their respective Plenipo-

tentiaries for this purpose, that is to say:

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, his Excellency the Marquess of Dufferin and Ava, her Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the French Republic, &c.

"And the President of the French Republic, his Excellency M. Marcellin Berthelot, Senator, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the French Republic, &c.

"Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

"ARTICLE I.

"The text of Article VII of the Extradition Treaty of the 14th August, 1876, is amended by the substitution of the words a Magistrate for the words the Police Magistrate who issued the warrant, or some other Police Magistrate in London, in the first sentence of the third paragraph of section (a), and by the omission of the word paragraph, and in the sections (b) and (d).

"ARTICLE II.

"The text of Article IX of the aforesaid Treaty is amended by the substitution of the words 'a Magistrate' for the words 'a Police Magistrate in London.'

"ARTICLE III.

"The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris as soon as possible.

"It shall come into force ten days after its publication in the manner prescribed by law in the respective countries, and shall have the same force and duration as the Treaty to which it relates.

"In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention, and have affixed thereto their seals.

"Done in duplicate at Paris, the 13th February, 1896.

"Lesquels, après s'être respectivement communiqué leurs pleins pouvoirs, reconnus en bonne et due forme, sont tombés d'accord sur les Articles suivants:—.

"ARTICLE I.

"Le texte de l'Article VII du Traité du 14 Août, 1876, est modifié par la substitution des mots 'un Magistrat' aux mots 'le Magistrat de Police qui a décerné le mandat d'arrêt ou tout autre Magistrat de Police à Londres,' dans la première partie du paragraphe 3 de la section (a), et par la suppression du mit 'police' dans la seconde partie du dit paragraphe, et dans les sections (b) et (d).

"ARTICLE II.

"Le texte de l'Article IX du même Traité est modifié par la substitution des mots 'un Magistrat' aux mots 'un Magistrat de Police à Londres.'

"ARTICLE III.

"La présente Convention sera ratifiée, et les ratifications seront échangées à Paris aussitô: quo possible.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged at Paris on the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, the sail Acts shall apply in the case of France, and of the said Convention with the President of the French Republic, and of the said Extradition Treaty as modified by the said Convention.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

3. Except where the context otherwise requires expressions used in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the said Order of the twenty-eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-

three.

IN pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows :-

1. The Northern and Salford Divisions (as defined by the Order in Council of the 4th day of May, 1864) of the County of Lancaster shall, for the purpose of the next Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of the Spring

Assize County, No. 2.
2. The said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be held at Manchester.

3. The Court at the said Spring Assizes at Manchester shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the county where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, 1879, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provision of Section three of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said section "the Sheriff of the county for which such Assizes were held" shall mean the Sheriff of the county in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring

Assizes Act, 1879, had not been passed.
4. The Sheriff of the County of Lancaster shall act for the purpose of the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.
5. The precepts of the Judges to the said

Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand

Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of Lancaster.

6. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Manchester, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any

Writ of Habeas Corpus.

7. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either Division comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit; or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the said Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document.

8. In all indictments and presentments at the said Spring Assizes the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the county where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize

County, No. 2."

9. Any person who after the date of this Order and before the said Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery, to be holden for either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at the said Spring Assizes for

the said Spring Assize County.

10. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence committed in either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such lastmentioned Spring Assizes or forfeit his recog-

11. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Manchester, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be made out, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of Lancaster, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute and give evidence at Manchester.

12. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus, such prisoners to Her Majesty's Gaol at Strangeways, Manchester, in the county of Lan-

caster, for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

13. The Clerk of Assize at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the county where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoner had been tried at the Assizes held in such

last-mentioned county.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the county or place from which he is com-mitted or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the county or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding 201. to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his as may have been by recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

14. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the county or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of Oyer and Terminer or Gaol Delivery in the county where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known agent on his behalf, shall attend the said Spring Assizes during the sitting of the

Court to pay all such orders.

15. Where the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the county or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

16. Except where the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order shall have the same

meaning as that which the same terms have in the

Spring Assizes Act, 1879.
17. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring C. L. Peel. Assizes, 1896.

N pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows:

1. The North and East Riding Division and the West Riding Division (as defined by the Order in Council of the 9th day of July, 1864) of the County of York and the County of the City of York, shall, for the purpose of the next Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of the Spring Assize County, No. 3.

2. The said Spring Assizes for the said Spring

Assize County shall be held at Leeds.

3. The Court at the said Spring Assizes at Leeds shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the county where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provision of Section three of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said Section "the Sheriff of the County for which such Assizes were held" shall mean the Sheriff of the County in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of York shall alone act for the purpose of the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and subject to the provisions of this Order shall have jurisdiction for that purpose over the whole district constituting the said Spring Assize County, and precepts and other documents relating to the said Spring Assizes shall be addressed to him

5. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of York; and the Jurors so summoned shall be deemed to be good and lawful men of the body of the several counties constituting the said Spring Assize County; and the Grand and Petty Jury formed out of those Jurors shall be deemed to be a Grand and Petty Jury respectively of the body of the said Counties respectively, and shall have jurisdiction accordingly.

6. The precepts of the Judges to the said

Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Leeds to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any writ of Habeas

Corpus.

7. In all matters not before specifically mentioned the precepts to the said Sheriff shall direct him to issue, and he shall issue the like notices, precepts, warrants, and documents, and perform the same acts (mutatis mutandis) as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, and

all Under Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Constables, and Officers in the said Spring Assize County shall

obey accordingly.

8. The said Sheriff shall, as to all matters in relation to such Spring Assizes for which no specific provision is made by this Order, have the same power, jurisdiction, and responsibility as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, except that this provision shall not authorize the said Sheriff to carry sentences into execution outside the county of York, or to levy outside the said County fines imposed or recognizances estreated at the said Spring Assizes.

9. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either of the Counties comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize or the proper officer thereof any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the said Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize or the proper officer thereof such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document. This provision shall not apply to the Sheriff of the County of the City of York.

10. In all indictments and presentments at the said Spring Assizes, the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the county where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize

County, No. 3."

11. Any person who after the date of this Order and before the said Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery, to be holden for any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at the said Spring Assizes for the said

Spring Assize County.

. 12. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence -committed in any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such last-mentioned Spring Assizes, or forfeit his recognizance.

: 13. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Leeds, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be made out, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of York, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recoginizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute and give evidence at Leeds. 14. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the said Spring-Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the said Spring Assizes

to be held, to send, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus, such prisoners to Her Majesty's Gaol at Leeds for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

15. The Clerk of Assize at the said Spring. Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the county where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoner had been tried at the Assizes held in such

last-mentioned county.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the county or place from which he is committed or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the county or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding 201, to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnesses as may have been bound by recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

16. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the county or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of Oyer and Terminer or Gaol Delivery in the county where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known agent on his behalf, shall attend the said Spring Assizes during the sitting of the Court to pay all such orders.

17. Where the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the county or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

18. Except where the context otherwise refor the said Spring: Assize County are appointed quires, terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as that which the same terms have in the Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

19. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring Assizes, 1896.

As regards Sailing Ships that Merchant Sailing Ships of the German Empire, the measurement whereof after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British Sailing Ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards Steamships, that Merchant Ships belonging to the said German Empire, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such Steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British Ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided, nevertheless, that if the Owner or Master of any such German Steamship desires the deduction for engine room in his Ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British Ships instead of under the German rule, the engine room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules; and that, in the event of any such Steamship possessing a certificate of tonnage or other national paper issued as aforesaid on or after the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eightyeight, denoting the net registered tonnage of

denoted thereon.

And whereas by Section eighty-four of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is enacted that, whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council that the tonnage regulations of that Act have been adopted by any foreign country, and are in force there, Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in

such Ship under the British rules, the Ship shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty in Council that the tonnage regulations of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the German Emperor, and such regulations are now in force in the German Empire, having come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five:

And whereas there still are or may be ships belonging to the German Empire to which the hereinbefore recited Order of the twenty-third July, one thousand eight hundred and eightynine, may apply, and it is expedient not to revoke the same, but to let the said recited Order remain in force so long as there are any ships to which the same may so apply:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been

complied with:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty (in pursuance and exercise of the powers hereinbefore mentioned) is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the merchant ships of the German Empire the measurement whereof shall, after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-live, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such ships, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that C. STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877, 40 and 41 Vict. cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to New College in the University of Oxford, in the matter of (a) tenure of rooms by Fellows, (b) application of Pension Fund, such amending Statutes being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-second day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

1. For Statute III, clause 32 to substitute the following:—

"The Warden and Fellows may set apart out of the general revenues of the College a yearly sum, not exceeding one thousand pounds, to form a Pension Fund for the payment of pensions to any person who may have served the college in the capacity of Tutor, or Lecturer, or Bursar, or in more than one of these capacities, and may add to the fund such a deduction, not exceeding ten pounds per centum per annum, from the Tuition Fund, as they may from time to time determine. The fund so formed shall be applied (subject to the provisions of these Statutes) under By-laws to be made by the Warden and Fellows: provided that no such pension shall be granted which the Pension Fund shall not in the judgment of the Warden and Fellows be sufficient to satisfy; and that every Pensioner shall be entitled to payment of his pension in priority to all others whose pensions shall have been subsequently granted. No such pension shall be payable except out of the Pension Fund. The Pension Fund shall be from time to time invested in securities in which Trust Funds may legally be invested: and the income of the fund (including therein the annual payment to the fund from the general revenues of the College, and the payment, if any, from the Tuition Fund) shall be applicable to the payment of current pensions. Any part of the income of the fund in any year not required for the payment of pensions due in that year shall be invested as part of the fund: and no pension shall be paid out of the principal of the fund."

And whereas it was on the twelfth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five resolved by the said Governing Body that it was expedient to further alter Section one of Statute XXVI the Section as amended hereinbefore particularly referred to and set out: Now therefore We the new Governing Body of Eton School do hereby alter the form and effect of the said Section and the said Section as altered by us will be in the terms following :-

STATUTE XXVI.

(B.) Tenable after quitting the School.

Section one as proposed to be amended -

(1) The Scholarships and Exhibitions known as the "Reynolds" "Bryant" "Berriman" "Hetherington" "Davies" and "Chamberlayne" shall be open by competition to all boys in the School, but not more than one of these Scholarships or Exhibitions shall be tenable by any Scholar or Exhibitioner.
