EXCHEQUER BILLS.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice to the holders of Exchequer Bills issued under the authority of the Act 29 V., c. 25, and dated the 11th March, 1892, that the interest thereon for the half year ending on the 11th March, 1896, will be payable at the Bank of England on and after the 11th March next; and that the interest of such Exchequer Bills for the following half year to 11th September, 1896, will be at the rate of three-quarters per centum per annum.

All holders of Exchequer Bills dated the 11th March, 1892, who intend to demand payment of the principal sums therein contained at the expiration of the fourth year of their currency, must leave the said Bills at the Bank of England for exami-

nation, not later than the 7th March next, between the hours of ten and two; and payment of the said principal sums will be made at the Bank on and after the 11th day of March next.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 25TH FEBRUARY 1896.)

THE Board of Agriculture; by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by Steamship Angers.

1. It shall not be lawful during the continuance of this Order for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any animals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamship Angers registered at the port of London, official number 87,027, and now owned by Mes-rs. Angier Brothers of London, and such conveyance of animals by that vessel is hereby prohibited accordingly.

Offences.

2. If an animal is conveyed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—
The Act of 1894 means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

Animals means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:
Master includes a person having the charge or command of the vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement and Duration.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and shall cease to operate from and immediately after the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
