PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200

at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families. Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Accounts Order: Appointment of Stocktaker:—

West Derby Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the West Derby Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said West Derby Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correct-

ness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards ahe stock remaining in store:

And whereas by Orders of the Local Government Board dated respectively the 6th day of August, 1884, and the 6th day of April, 1889, similar requirements are made with respect to certain Accounts prescribed by those Orders for the Infirmary and the Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouses, Infirmary, and Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said West Derby Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Union for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as the Local Government Board shall from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to Our consent, or be removed by Us, or be proved to be insane by evidence which We may deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to Us of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with Our assent, appoint a person or persons to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker, for a limited period only.

ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouses, Infirmary and Cottage Homes belonging to the said Guardians, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account and the Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account.

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouses, Infirmary, and Cottage Homes, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

He shall also on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores in the charge of the Dispenser of the Infirmary and shall compare the same with the Accounts required to be kept by that officer.

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

" , 18., and found to be correct as "regards the quantities of stock remaining in store."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Masters of the Workhouses, the Steward and the Dispenser of the Infirmary, and the Superintendent of the Cottage Homes shall when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Masters of the Workhouses, the Steward and the Dispenser of the Infirmary, and the Superintendent of the Cottage Homes shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Orders dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 24 and 30. Candidates must be of the prescribed

age on the first day of the Examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and practical training they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must show (1) that they have served, for at least three years, in a public or private office, under a Civil Engineer or Architect in general practice, or a Superintending Engineer of one of Her Majesty's Dockyards; and (2) that they have fully profited by their practical training, and possess the necessary qualifications and experience. Evidence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If it prove prima facie satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to Examination, subject to such further inquiry as may be necessary.

12. Sanitary Engineering.

13. Drawing and Design of Engineering Works, including the Construction of Railways, Roads, Harbours, Docks, Bridges, and Breakwaters.

14. Architectural Drawing, including design

and ornament.

Candidates must satisfy the Commissioners in (a) Handwriting and Spelling, (b) in at least three of the subjects 2 to 8, and (c) in subjects 9 to 12, and either 13 or 14.

IV. A fee of £6 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

Sendai Bay-Breahers Westward of Aji Shima. THE Japanese Government has given notice, dated 21st December, 1895, that the Commander of the steam-vessel "Goyomaru" reports having observed breakers, on apparently a sunken rock; lying about S.S.E. (S. 22° E.), distant about 2½ miles from. Daikoku Saki, south-east part of Sendai Bay; or approximately in lat. 38° 15½' N., long. 141° 26¾ E. six. The words "Breakers reported" have been

written in the locality on the Admiralty Charts.

Sunken Rocks in Approach to Kelung Harbour.

THE Japanese Government has given notice, that the undermentioned dangers have been found in a recent survey of the approaches to Kelung Harbour, north coast of Formosa:
