In the Matter of the Companies Acts 1862 to 1890 and in the Matter of Roberts and Roberts Limited.

BY an Order made by Mr. Justice Romer (acting for Mr. Justice Vaughan Williams) in the above matters dated the 9th day of March 1896 on the petition of J. Stafford Sons and Oswin creditors praying that an Order might be made for the winding up of the said Company by the Court or in the alternative that the voluntary winding up of the said Company might be continued but subject to the supervision of the Court. It was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the said Roberts and Roberts Limited be continued, but subject to the supervision of the Court; and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up might be adopted as the Court should think fit. And it was ordered that Reuben Robinson Preston the Liquidator in the voluntary winding up of the said Company do on the 9th April next and on the same day in each succeeding month file with the Registrar Companies (Winding-up) a report in writing as to the position of and the progress made with the winding up of the said Company and with the realization of the assets thereof and as to any other matters connected with the winding up as the Court might from time to time direct. And it was ordered that no bills of costs charges or expenses or special remuneration of any Solicitor employed by the Liquidator of the said Company or any remuneration charges or expenses of such Liquidator or of any Manager Accountant Auctioneer Broker or other person be paid out of the assets of the said Company unless such costs charges expenses or remuneration should have been taxed or allowed by the Registrar Companies (Winding-up). And it was ordered that all such costs charges expenses and remuneration be taxed and ascertained accordingly. And it was ordered that the costs of the petitioners and of the Company and of the creditors and contributories appearing on the said petition be taxed and paid out of the assets of the Company but in such taxation only one set of costs was to be allowed to the Company and to Armitage Brothers and 120 other creditors and the said contributories and only one set of costs was to be allowed to Kingan and Company Limited and Taylor Brothers Limited and ten other creditors. And the creditors contributories and Liquidator of the said Company and all other persons interested were to be at liberty to apply as there might be occasion.—Dated the 19th day of March 1896.
