By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200

at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order. Out-door Labour Test :-

Blandford Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Blandford

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Blandford Union, as follows:

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say,-

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles

of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall

be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3 .- If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise

lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of

such an officer.

Order made by the Board of Trade amending the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order 1893.

1. THIS Order may be cited as "The Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order 1893 Amend-ment Order 1896."

2. Section 15 of the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order 1893 is as from the date of this Order hereby revoked and section 3 of this Order and the Agreement between the London Tilbury and Southend Railway Company and the Secretary of State referred to therein are hereby respectively substituted for the said revoked section and

the Agreement therein referred to.
3. The Agreement between the London Tilbury and Southend Railway Company and the Secretary of State set forth in the schedule to this Order annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and made binding upon the parties thereto and the provisions contained in the said Agreement shall be of the same force and effect as if they were set forth in this Order and may and shall be carried into full effect by the said Railway Company and the Secretary of State respectively and notwithstanding anything in the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order 1893 or in this Order the Secretary of State shall not acquire any right over any land or property of the said Railway Company other than such rights as are conferred on him by the Agreement referred to in the said revoked section and the Agreement set forth in the schedule to this Order.

4. The Agreement set forth in the schedule to this Order annexed may at any time or times hereafter be amended extended or varied by the said Railway Company and the Secretary of State by mutual consent in any manner they may think fit and the said Agreement as so amended extended or varied shall be deemed to be hereby confirmed and made binding upon the parties thereto, and shall be of the same force and effect in all respects as if such amendments extensions and variations thereof had been originally included in and formed part of the said Agreement as hereby confirmed.

5. Save so far as the same are expressed to be hereby revoked amended extended or varied or are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order all the provisions of the Shoeburyness Military pany on their own land for the occupation of their Tramways Order 1893 are hereby confirmed and continued in force. purposes shall be supplied from the new well

SCHEDULE.

An Agreement made this fourth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five between the London Tilbury and Southend Railway Company (hereinafter called the Company) of the one part and Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department of the other part. Whereas on the eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one the said parties hereto entered into an Agreement under seal a copy whereof is set forth in the schedule hereto and which is hereinafter called the scheduled Agreement. And whereas the stipulations of the scheduled Agreement with respect to the user and maintenance of the tramway therein mentioned and the supply of water to the Company from the new well therein mentioned have been duly observed and performed by both parties ever since the execution of the scheduled Agreement and the siding mentioned in clause 2 of the scheduled Agreement has been constructed and the Provisional Order referred to in the last clause of the scheduled Agreement was in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetythree obtained from the Board of Trade and such Order has been confirmed in manner required by the Military Tramways Act 1887. And whereas the said parties hereto are desirous of substituting for the scheduled Agreement an Agreement containing the stipulations hereinafter expressed.

Now, it is hereby agreed as follows:-

1. The War Department having constructed the said tramway and fenced in the same may during the continuance of this Agreement use the said tramway with a single line of rails in the course shown by the line A C D B in the plan referred to in the scheduled Agreement and during such period the War Department shall maintain and keep the same tramway in proper order and condition and shall work the same so as to interfere as little as possible with the Company's traffic and business.

2. The War Department shall during the continuance of this Agreement have the right to the exclusive use free of charge of the siding leading from the Company's railway into the said tramway which has been constructed under clause 2 of the scheduled Agreement. But the points by which the said siding communicates with the said tramway shall be under the control of the Company's station master or other appointed officer. And during the continuance of this Agreement the said siding and points shall be maintained and kept in good repair by the Company and the War Department will from time to time on demand repay to the Company one-half of the total amount of maintenance and repair thereof.

3. The Secretary of State for the time being of the War Department shall during the continuance of this Agreement have the right of occupation and user of the said tramway subject nevertheless to the payment to the Company of the annual rent

of ten shillings.

4. The War Department will during the continuance of this Agreement supply to the Company at the price and in the manner hereinafter mentioned such quantities of water as the Company shall from time to time require for locomotive and other similar purposes and also for domestic purposes to the Company's station buildings and to any houses erected or to be erected by the Com-

pany on their own land for the occupation of their servants. The water so required for domestic purposes shall be supplied from the new well mentioned in the scheduled Agreement and the water so required for all purposes other than domestic puposes shall be supplied from the old well mentioned in the scheduled Agreement.

5. Before giving any such supply as aforesaid the War Department shall be entitled to take and retain from the said new well for the purposes of the troops and War Department establishment at Shoeburyness and of persons there in the employ of the War Department and generally for any military purpose there a supply per diem of sixty thousand gallons of water and the War Department shall not under these presents be under any obligation to supply water to the Company as aforesaid save so far as the retention of such lastmentioned supply will permit or be under any obligation to enlarge or deepen the said new well for the purpose of giving a supply under these presents.

6. The Company shall pay to the said Secretary of State for the time being for all water supplied to the Company as aforesaid the sum of eightpence per one thousand gallons or such less sum as the Company and the said Secretary of State for the time being shall agree upon and the sums payable under this clause shall be payable quarterly on the twenty-fifth day of March the twentyfourth day of June the twenty-ninth day of September and the twenty-fifth day of December in every year. Provided always that if the War Department shall at any time supply and sell by meter water from either of the said wells to the inhabitants of Shoeburyness or any other persons for other than military purposes the Company shall be entitled to have their supply at the lowest rate (such rate being in no case more than eightpence per one thousand gallons) for the time being charged to any such other consumers by

7. For the purpose of such water supply to the Company as aforesaid such alterations and additions as the Company and the Commanding Royal Engineer for the time being of the district shall agree upon shall forthwith be made in and to the pipes and other appliances already laid down and fixed for the purpose of the water supply provided under the scheduled Agreement. The said alterations and additions shall be carried out partly by the Company and partly by the War Department as may be agreed between the Company and the said Commanding Royal Engineer but the whole cost of carrying out the same shall be borne by the Company. After the completion of the said alterations and additions the Company shall during the continuance of this Agreement at their own cost maintain and keep in good repair such parts of the said pipes and appliances as are situate upon their ground and the War Department shall during the continuance of this Agreement at their own cost maintain and keep in repair such parts thereof as are not situate upon the Company's ground.

8. For the purpose of such water supply to the Company as aforesaid the Company at their own cost shall during the continuance of this Agreement maintain two or more proper meters for the purpose of measuring the quantity of water supplied to them from the said two wells respectively and the War Department shall at all reasonable times have access to such meters for the purpose of checking the consumption of the water supplied.

9. The water for any day's supplies as aforesaid to the Company may from time to time be turned

on at such hour as the said Commanding Royal | required) between the said tramway and their Engineer shall from time to time think fit.

it 10. The Company shall not during the continuance of this Agreement sell or supply from off their premises any water supplied to them as aforesaid or permit the user thereof except under

the conditions of this Agreement.

11. The War Department shall not be under any liability to the Company in respect of any failure or stoppage or break down of the said water supply to the Company under this Agreement whether through frost or accident or any other cause whatever but if any such shall happen the War Department shall make every reasonable endeavour to reinstate the supply with as little delay as possible. Provided always that in the event of the War Department being unable at any time during the continuance of this Agreement by reason of an insufficient supply of water from the new well to give to the Railway Company a daily supply of water from that well as herein provided the War Department shall so long as they are unable to give such sufficient supply from the new well to the Railway Company as aforesaid make up and complete such supply with water from the old well but the War Department shall not be bound in any case to furnish to the Railway Company water from the said old well unless the War Department shall have water for that purpose after all the requirements of the War Department shall have been met and the War Department shall be under no obligation to enlarge or deepen the said wells or either of them for the purpose of giving a supply under these presents.

12. Either party that is to say the Company on the one hand or the said Secretary of State for the time being on the other hand may determine this Agreement upon or at any time after the expiration of the term of twenty-one years from the date hereof by giving to the other party six calendar months' previous notice in writing in that behalf. And in the event of and immediately upon such determination all the rights and liabilities hereby conferred and imposed upon the said respective parties hereto shall absolutely cease and

determine.

13. The War Department shall as soon as may be make under the Military Tramways Act 1887 an application to the Board of Trade for a Provisional Order under that Act confirming this Agreement and the Company will consent to any such Order.

An Agreement made this eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one between the London Tilbury and Southend Railway Company (hereinafter called the Company) of the one part and Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department of the other part whereas the War Department in anticipation of this Agreement for the purpose of effecting communication between certain of their ranges at Shoeburyness in the county of Essex and for other purposes and with the permission of the Company have constructed a tramway passing through the yard of the Company's Shoeburyness station in the course shown by the line A C D B in the plan hereto annexed. And whereas the Company are willing to grant to the War Department an easement in respect of the said tramway railway in the terms hereinafter appearing.

Now it is hereby agreed as follows:-

1. The War Department having constructed the said tramway and fenced in the same may during the continuance of this Agreement use the said tramway with a single line of rails in the course shown by the line A C D B in the plan hereto and during such period the War Depart-ment shall maintain and keep the same tramway in proper order and condition and shall work the same so as to interfere as little as possible with

the Company's traffic and business.

2. If and when the War Department shall by notice in writing so require the Company will at their own cost with all convenient speed constructs for the exclusive use of the War Department and the War Department shall thenceforth have the right to exclusively use free of charge accordingly in the course shown by the dotted red line drawn in the said plan or in some equally convenient course a siding leading from the Company's railway into the said tramway and communicating. therewith by proper points which shall be under the control of the Company's station master or. other appointed officer and from and after the completion of such siding to the satisfaction of the Commanding Royal Engineer for the time being of the district the same shall be maintained and kept in good repair by the Company and the War Department will from time to time on demand repay to the Company one-half of the total amount of maintenance and repair thereof.

3. The Company will upon the request and at the cost of the Secretary of State for the time being of the War Department grant to him the right of occupation and user of the said tramway during the continuance of this Agreement subject nevertheless to the reservation to the Company of the

annual rent of ten shillings.

4. The War Department having sunk a new well at Shoeburyness and having obtained therefrom a sufficient water supply will subject to the provisions of Clause 5 supply to the Company from such well and by means of such pipes and tanks as hereinafter mentioned for locomotive and other purposes including a supply to the cottages inhabited by the Company's servants and situate on their own premises at Shoeburyness not less than eight thousand five hundred gallons of water per diem as the Company shall from time to time require and at the price hereinafter mentioned.

5. Before giving any such daily supply as aforesaid the War Department shall be entitled to take and retain from the said new well for the purposes of the troops and War Department establishment at Shoeburyness and of persons there in the employ of the War Department and generally for any military purpose there a supply per diem of sixty thousand gallons of water and the War Department shall not under these presents be under any obligation to supply water to the Company as aforesaid save so far as the retention of such last-mentioned supply will permit or be under any obligation to enlarge or deepen the said well for the purpose of giving a supply under these presents.

6. The Company shall pay to the said Secretary of State for the time being for all water supplied to the Company as aforesaid the sum of one shilling per one thousand gallons or such less sum as the Company and the said Secretary of State for the time being shall agree upon the sum payable under this clause to be paid quarterly on the twenty-fifth day of March the twenty-fourth day of June the twenty-ninth day of September and and to make a communication (if and when the twenty-fifth day of December in every year. Provided always that if the War Department shall at any time supply and sell by meter water from the said well to the inhabitants of Shoeburyness or any other persons for other than military purposes the Company shall be entitled to have their supply at the lowest rate such rate being in no case more than one shilling per one thousand gallons for the time being charged to any such other consumers by meter.

7. For the purpose of such water supply to the Company as aforesaid the War Department shall at their own cost before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of this Agreement lay down from the said well and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain and keep in repair an iron pipe of not less than three inches internal diameter to some point on the boundary of the Company's Shoeburyness station to be agreed upon between the said Commanding Royal Engineer for the time being and the Company's engineer and the Company shall at their own costs and within the same period and in continuation of the pipe so laid down by the War Department lay down from that point and thenceforth during the continuation of this Agreement maintain and keep in good repair an iron pipe of the same diameter to the tank next hereinafter mentioned and also a proper stop cock thereon for shutting off the water therein from the said tank.

8. For the purpose of such water supply to the Company as aforesaid the Company shall also. at their own cost before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of this Agreement. erect and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain at their said Shoeburyness station a tank holding not less than twentyfive thousand gallons and the height of the top or upper edge which shall not be more than thirty feet above the level of the station platform there and also at their own costs within the same period fix and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain and keep in good repair on their own ground on the pipe so to be laid down by them as aforesaid at the junction thereof with the pipe so to be laid down as aforesaid by the War Department a proper water meter for measuring the said supply and the War Department shall at all reasonable times have access to the meter for the purpose of checking the consumption of the water supplied.

9. The water for any day's supply as aforesaid to the Company may from time to time be turned on by the War Department at such hour as the Commanding Officer shall from time to time think fit.

10. The Company shall not during the continuance of this Agreement sell or supply from off their premises any water supplied to them as aforesaid or permit the user thereof except under the conditions of these presents.

11. The War Department shall not be under any liability to the Company in respect of any failure or stoppage or breakdown of the said water supply to the Company under this Agreement whether through frost or accident or any other cause whatever but if any such shall happen the War Department shall make every reasonable endeavour to reinstate the supply with as little delay as possible. Provided always that in the event of the War Department being unable at any time during the continuance of this Agreement by reason of an insufficient supply of water from the new well to give to the Railway Company a daily supply of water as herein provided the War Department shall so long as they are unable to give such sufficient supply from the new well to the Railway Company as aforesaid furnish to the

Railway Company water from the old well from which they have hitherto obtained their supply but the War Department shall not be bound to furnish to the Railway Company water from the said old well unless the War Department shall have water for that purpose after all the requirements of the War Department shall have been met.

12. Either party that is to say the Company on the one hand or the said Secretary of State for the time being on the other hand may determine the provisions of this Agreement upon or at any time after the expiration of the term of fourteen years from the date of this Agreement by giving to the other six calendar months' previous notice in writing in that behalf. And in the event of and immediately upon such determination all the rights and liabilities hereby conferred and imposed upon the said respective parties hereto shall

absolutely cease and determine.

Lastly. The War Department shall as soon as may be make under the Military Tramways Acts 1887 an application to the Board of Trade for a Provisional Order under that Act confirming this Agreement the Company will consent to any such: Order but if such Provisional Order shall not be made and also confirmed as in the said Act men-: tioned then and in any such case these presents. shall be void.
