THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, containing the following Quarantine Notice issued by the Bulgarian Government, viz.:—Medical inspection is imposed from the 17th instant on vessels from Odessa and other Russian and Turkish Black Sea ports which have not been inspected at Sulina. If their bilge water and drinking water have not been changed at Sulina they will be changed at the first Bulgarian port called at.
