The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to these Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Maiesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200 at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

List of Fines which may be incurred by Shipping in Brazilian Ports in connection with

Quarantine Regulations :-

Giving incorrect information on arrival respecting occurrences on board ... \$200 Concealing sick persons on board whatever the nature of sickness; sending them to Hospital without previous permission of Sanitary Authority; or taking a medical man on board without the same permission \$200

And if the sickness is pestilent, for each sick person \$500

N.B.—Any medical man going on boardto examine and treat patients without previous permission of Sanitary Authority is fined

Failing to carry out the disinfecting and sanitary measures ordered by Sanitary Authority within the time marked; or failing to effect the change of anchorage determined \$

determined \$100 N.B.—This fine is doubled for recur-

Allowing entrance to or withdrawal from ship in quarantine, of persons other than those in the Sanitary Service ... \$200

To be repeated on each occurrence.

Changing anchorage of a ship in quarantine without previous permission of the Sanitary Authority ... \$200

Omitting to bring Bill of Health from port of departure or ports of call ...

N.B.—At ports where there is no Brazilian Consul, captains should obtain Bills of Health from Local Authorities or Consuls of other countries.

Infringing the terms of any permit granted

by Sanitary Authority ... Regulations for which no special fine is awarded, will be punished with a fine of \$20 to \$50, to be doubled on recurrence.

Note.—Where fines are collected by the Director of the Lazaretto and not by the Custom House, the loading or discharging work will be stopped until the fine is paid. If such work is already finished the Doctor of the Lazaretto will not endorse the Bill of Health or grant pratique until the fine is paid.

Should the vessel leave without paying the fine no other vessel belonging to the same owners, or commanded by the same captain, will be allowed to load or discharge in the port so long as the fine is left unsettled.

(Translation.)
Ministry of the Interior.—Royal Order. WHEREAS it is officially notified to this Ministry that cholera at Alexandria and Damietta (Egypt), which towns were declared foul by Royal Orders of January 3 and October 17 last respectively, has ceased:

In pursuance of, &c., &c., &c.

The King, &c., &c., &c., has been pleased to

order that said places be declared clean.

Vessels which have sailed from Alexandria after the 11th instant and arrived at our ports after the 31st instant, shall therefore be admitted to free pratique if they arrive with a clean bill of health visé by the Spanish Consul or, if there be none, by that of another nation, in good sanitary condition, and without the occurrence of any suspicious case on board; provided always that none of the dispositions which would entail the application of quarantine have been violated. As regards vessels arriving from Damietta they will be admitted without any restriction of date.

Vessels arriving from ports declared in the aforesaid Royal Orders of January 3 and October 17 as specially compromised, shall also be granted free pratique if they arrive in good

sanitary condition.

Goods declared as suspected in the Royal Order of October 29, 1886, which have remained in Alexandria during the epidemic and arrive in our territory after the 20th instant, and without any re-triction of date for those from Damietta, shall likewise be admitted without disinfection.

And to all others whom it may concern

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas the said John Meredyth Evans is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and is acting as Auditor for the Gloucestershire Audit District;

And whereas it is expedient that another District should be assigned to the said John Meredyth Evans in lieu of the said Gloucestershire Audit District:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said John Meredyth Evans accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor, on and after the date hereof, to audit the accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely,—

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Poor Law Unions.

(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to be audited by any other District Auditor.

(4.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are

prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said John Meredyth Evans shall, on and after the date hereof, act as Auditor, for the performance of his duties under this Order, and which District We hereby assign to him, shall be termed "The Sussex Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Poor Law. Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (4) of Article I.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Name of Union:—

Cookham (Maidenhead) Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Cookham Union ;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union;—And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876," it is enacted as follows:—

"The Local Government Board may, when "they see fit, by their Order change the name of any Union, and direct how such change of name shall be published; no such change of name shall affect any rights or obligations of, or securities given by or to, the said Union, or render defective any

"legal proceedings instituted by or against "the said Union; and any legal proceedings "may be continued or commenced by or "against the said Union by their new name "which might have been continued or commenced by or against the Union by their "former name."

And whereas by an Order dated the 30th day of June, 1835, the Poor Law Commissioners declared that the several Parishes and Places specified in the margin thereof should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and the Union so constituted has since been known by the name of the Cookham Union

And whereas by the County of Berks (Maidenhead, &c.) Confirmation Order, 1894, the Parishes of Bray and Cookham were divided and the new Parishes constituted under that Order, namely, the Parishes of Bray, Cookham, and Maidenhead were included in the said Cookham Union;

And whereas it is expedient that the name of the said Union should be changed as hereinafter mentioned:
