a . The privilege of making presentations to The " Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously pre-- sented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty. The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two doys previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to : Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presenta-tion cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained. at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

HER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the First Class on -

Mr. WILLIAM JOHN NUTMAN, late Master of the S.S. "Aidar," of Liverpool.

The following is an account of the services

in respect of which the decoration has been conferred :-

At 2 a.m., on the 19th January, 1896, while the S.S. "Staffordshire," of Liverpool, was on a voyage from Marseilles to Port Said, signals of distress were observed to be proceeding from the S.S. "Aidar," also of Liverpool, and the "Staffordshire" immediately proceeded to her assistance. As the "Aidar" was found to be sinking fast, three of the "Staffordshire's" lifeboats were at once launched, and with great difficulty, owing to the darkness and the heavy sea, succeeded in rescuing her passengers and crew, 29 in number. "At 6.10 A.M. the only persons left on the "Aidar" were Mr. NUTMAN (the Master), and an injured and helpless fireman, whom he was endeavouring to save, and whom he absolutely refused to abandon.

The steamer was now rapidly settling down, and as it was no longer safe to remain near her. the Officer in charge of the rescuing boat asked Mr. NUTMAN for a final answer. He still persisted in remaining with the injured man, choosing rather to face almost certain death than to leave

him to his fate. The men in the boat were obliged to pull away

and immediately afterwards, at 6.17 A.M., the "Aidar" gave one or two lurches and foundered.

After she disappeared, Mr. NUTMAN was seen on the bottom of an upturned boat, still holding the fireman. Half an hour elapsed before the rescuing boat could approach, but eventually Mr. NUTMAN and the fireman were picked up and taken on board the "Staffordshire," where the injured man was with difficulty restored by the Ship's Surgeon.

Conseil Sanitaire, Maritime et Quarantenaire d'Egypte. Alexandrie,

le 20 Mars, 1896. Le Gouverneur Général de l'Algérie vient

d'autoriser cette année le Pèlerinage aux Lieux Saints du Hedjaz moyennant l'exécution des dispositions suivantes :-

Les bateaux qui prendront à leur bord dans les ports de l'Algérie les pèlerins à destination des Lieux Saints seront au départ l'objet d'une visite médicale rigoureuse, en vue de constater que les passagers ne sont atteints d'aucune maladie transmissible, et que le navire présent des conditions hygiéniques satisfaisantes.

Ces bâtiments devront transiter le Canal de Suez avec des gardes sanitaires qui seront au préalable soumis à cinq jours d'observation à Port Said, et ils seront tenus de se rendre, sans aucune escale intermédiaire, à Djeddah où ils subiront une nouvelle visite médicale.

Des dispositions analogues seront également prises par la Tunisie en ce qui concerne les

pèlerins de la Régence.

La seconde partie de cette règlementation est, comme vous le voyez, Monsieur le Président, en conformité avec les mesures arrêtées en Décembre dernier par le Conseil Supérieur de Santé de Constantinople pour éviter aux navires à pèlerins venant de la Méditerranée toute compromission avec l'Egypte et leur permettre d'obtenir immédiatement libre pratique à Djeddah. Présentées par le Délégué Ottoman au Conseil Sanitaire, ces mesures ont été approuvées et rendues exécutoires en Egypte par cette Assemblée dans sa séance du 7 janvier dernier. Je vous serai obligé de vouloir bien communiquer cette information à mes honorables Collègues du Conseil Supérieure.

The time during which the taking and killing of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire shall be extended so as to be from the 1st March to the 11th August in each year, both days inclusive.

IN pur-uance of the powers conferred on me' by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Norfolk, I hereby make the following Orders:

 The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of one year, from the 1st day of May, 1896,

within the following areas:-

Hickling Broad, Whitesley and Heigham Sounds, Blackfleet Broad, Horsey Mere, Marthami and Somerton Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith, including the Hundred Stream or Thurne River and ancient? bed, and the rands and walls thereof from Heigham! Bridge to the sea at Winterton, and all the marshes and low-lying and uncultivated lands, fens, reed grounds, warrens, maram, or sand hills, and seashore, to the line of high water mark, in the several Parishes of Waxham, Horsey, Potter Heigham, and Hickling, and such part of the Parish of Catfield as lies to the east of the Midland and Great Northern Joint Railway.

The warrens, maram or sand hills, and seashore to the line of high water mark, in the Parish

of Winterton.

And the series of Broads known as Ormesby, Rollesby, Hemsby, Filby, and Burgh Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and the dykes communicating therewith, and the fens, reed grounds, and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures adjacent thereto, including Lady Broad or Hard Fen Water in the parish of Filby, Brandyke Broad in the Parish of Burgh St. Margaret, and Muckfleet Dyke, and the marshes and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures near or adjacent thereto respectively.

2. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of one year from the 1st day of May, 1896, within the following areas, viz, the whole of the foreshore, including the shingle, sand hills, salt marshes, creeks, and other unenclosed lands extending from high water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated land separating the foreshore from them, from Estuary Sluice at North Wootton to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Cley-next-the-Sea.

CRDER OF THE LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL RE-ARRANGING THE WARDS OF THE PARISH OF ST. MARIN-IN-THE-FIELDS APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

To the Vestry of the Parish of St. Martinin-the Fields;

And all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of the London County Council (General Powers) Acr, 1893, it is enacted that the London County Council may from time to time for the purpose of elections of vestrymen, upon the application in writing of the vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of a par sh mentioned in Schedules A and B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, by Order under their scal, re-arrange the wards in such parish, and determine the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Council shall, in making any such re-arrangement, apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard so far as practicable as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and it is also by the said Act enacted that any such Order may contain such provisions with reference to the election, rotation, and retirement of vestrymen (whether elected prior or subsequently to the date of the Order) as the Council may think necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Urder.

And whereas the parish of St. Martin-in-the-Fields is a parish mentioned in Part II of Schedule A to the Metropolis Management Act, 18.55, and pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, the said parish was divided into three wards.

And whereas the vestry of the said parish of St. Martin-in-the-Fields hath applied to the London County Council to re-arrange the wards of the said parish pursuant to the provisions of the said 15th section of the London County, Council (General Powers) Act, 1893.

And whereas it appears from the rate books ofthe said parish prepared in the month of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, that the said parish contains two thousand four hundred and twenty-one rated householders, and that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish is five hundred and fourteen thousand

six hundred and eighty-five pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of St. Martin-in-the-Fields be and the same are hereby re-arranged in manner following, that is to say, that the said parish be divided into three wards, that the three wards be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first: column of the undermentioned Schedule, that the extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of Vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

And whereas the London County Council thinks it neces ary that this Order should, for the purpose of carrying out the foregoing provisions, contain the following provisions with reference to the election, rotation and retirement of Vestrymen:

Now the said London County Council doth hereby further order as follows, that is to say—

(1.) That at the time appointed for the election of Vestrymen in 1896, all the Vestrymen then in office shall go out of office, and there shall be an election of the whole number of Vestrymen for each of the said wards.

(2.) That one-third of the Vestrymen then elected in each of the said wards shall go out of office at the time appointed for the election of Vestrymen in the year 1897, one other third of them at the time appointed for such election in the year 1898, and the remaining third at the time appointed for such election in the year 18.9.

(3.) That the one-third who are respectively to go out of office in the years 1897 and 1898 shall be determined according to their place on the poll at the election, those Vestrymen who were lowest on the poll going out of office first. If there shall have been no poll, or if a question shall arise in consequence of an equality of votes between two or more Vestrymen, the vestry shall at some meeting before the time of the election in 1897 determine by lot which of the Vestrymen elected in 1896 shall constitute the one-third to go out of office in the years 1897 and 1898 respectively.

South-Eastern Counties Audit District.
Tonbridge Rural District.

To Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith, District Auditor ;-

To the Rural District Council of Tonbridge ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of May, 1895, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith as a District Auditor, and

ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which should be termed "The South-Eastern Counties Audit District," should, for the performance of the duties assigned to him by Article II of the Order, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in Schedule B to that Order, and the Districts. mentioned in paragraphs (3), (4), and (5) of the said Article II and the Districts or areas referred to in paragraph 7 of Article II of the Order;

... THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Infected Area.

1. This Order shall apply only to an Area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area which Area is in this Order referred to as an Infected Area.

Restriction on Movement of Swine within out of or into Infected Area.

2. Swine shall not be moved along a highway or thoroughfare within out of or into an Infected SArea, except as expressly authorized by this ...Order.

-nic Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through an Infected Area by railway from a place outside that Area to another place outside that Area without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that Area.

#### Movement of Swine within out of or into Infected Area.

3:-(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place) may be moved within out of or into an Infected Area with a Movement Licence (in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect), which Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place and premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect hereinafter provided, as to the correctness of which Declaration the person granting the Licence shall satisfy himself before granting the Licence.

(2:) The swine moved under this Order shall be accompanied by the Licence and Declaration

(3.) The swine shall be moved to the specified premises by a route to be prescribed in the Licence.

(4.) A Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted od under this Order.

(b.) that the swine are not affected with swinefever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and .

(c.) that the movement of such swine is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

#### Licence for Movement into Infected Area.

5. If the movement is to be into an Infected Area the Movement Licence must be the Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises to which the swine are to be moved are situate, and the Declaration shall be to the effect-

(a.) that the swine to be moved are not affected with swine-fever and have not been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever;

(b.) that the movement of such swine is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under

any Order of the Board.

### Licence for Movement within Infected Area. for Breeding Purposes.

6.—(1.) If the movement is to be within an Infec ed Area for breeding purposes the Move-ment Licence must be the Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved are situate, and the Declaration shall be to the

(a.) that the premises from which and the premises to which the swine are to be moved are both situate within the Infected Area; and

(b.) that the swine are to be moved for breed-

ing purposes, and for no other purpose; and (c.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other pig has been brought on to those premises within such period ; and

(d.) that the swine are not affected with swinefever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and\_

(c.) that the movement of such swine is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) A Licence granted for the movement of swine for breeding purposes under this Order shall be available for the movement of the swine back to the premises from which they were moved under the Licence by the route specified in the Licence: Provided that such movement shall take Licence of the Local Authority of the District in place within the four days during which, such which the premises from which the swine are to Licence is available.

#### Straying of Swine on Highways.

7.—(1.) No pig shall be allowed to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof within an Infected Area.

(2.) If any person allows a pig to so stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

### As to Movement of Swine landed from Ireland through Infected Area.

8. For the purposes of this Order, swine landed from Ireland at a port or place in an Infected Area shall not be deemed to be moved within out of or into that Area where they are moved to any place of: destination out of that Area in accordance with the following conditions:

(a.) When landed the swine shall be moved forthwith by the most direct available route to the nearest available railway-station (such station being within that Area) on the line of railway by which the swine are to be moved to their place of destination.

(b.) The swine shall be kept at the said railwaystation until trucked, and shall then be moved by railway to the place of destination without untrucking.

# Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

9. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, swine may be moved in any circumstances with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a-person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

#### Granting of Movement Licences.

-10.—(1.) A Local Authority may appoint fit and proper persons for the purpose of granting, subject to the provisions of this Article, Movement Licences for the purposes of this Order.

(2.) A Licence shall only be granted for the movement of swine under this Order, where in the opinion of the Local Authority or the persons granting the Licence, as the case may be, the movement of the swine is necessary or expedient.

(3.) Provided that a Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

#### Delivery of Declarations.

11 -(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted,

(2.) The person granting such Licence under this Order shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving

the Licence from him.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

12.-(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

# Local Authority to enforce Order. . . . .

13. The provisions of this Order, except-where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

14.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Interpretation.

15. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture: "Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board.

### Commencement.

16. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.
