TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six in the words and figures following; that it is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul Daybrook situate within the limits of the parish of Arnold in the county of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Arnold and of the particular district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and of such particular district respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Arnold and of the said particular

district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Paul Daybrook situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his see of the perpetual curacy of the said particular district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington and with the consent of Sir Charles Seely of Sherwood Lodge Baronet as the patron of the vicarage of the parish of Arnold aforesaid (in testimony whereof, they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Arnold and of the said particular district of Saint John the Evangelist, Carrington which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Paul Daybrook situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul Daybrook.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul Daybrook comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Arnold in the county of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell which is bounded upon part of the east by the parish of Calverton upon the north partly by the last-named parish and partly by the parish of Papplewick both in the said county and diocese upon the west partly by the new parish of Bestwood Park in the same county and diocese and partly by the parish of Basford in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the said diocese of Southwell upon the south-west partly by the particular district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington and partly by the new parish of Saint Ann Nottingham both in the said town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell aforesaid upon the south-east partly by the new parish of Saint Paul Carlton in the Willows and partly by the parish of Gedling both in the county of Nottingham aforesaid and in the said diocese of Southwell and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gedling from the parish of Arnold aforesaid at the junction of the road called or known as the Plains otherwise called or known as the Woodborough-road with the Gedling-road and extending thence first north-westward then south-westward and then again north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one mile and eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Front-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with High-street and with Nottingham-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the cross road

or lane leading past the house called or known as Cherry Hill into the Mansfield-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the said cross road or lane for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Mansfield-road aforesaid and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one mile and thirty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Ollerton and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of seventy-three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Oxton and extending thence north-eastward along the south-eastern side of the last-mentioned road for a distance of sixty-seven chains or thereabouts to a point distant six chains or thereabouts south-west of the house called Forest Farm upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Arnold from the parish of Calverton aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said particular district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington which is bounded upon the north-west partly by the parish of Basford aforesaid and partly by the above described portion of the parish of Arnold upon part of the east by the said portion of the last-named parish and upon all other sides that is to say upon the remaining part of the east and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Arnold from the particular district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington aforesaid at the junction of Scout-lane with the Mansfield-road aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Edward-lane and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to a point at the centre of the bridge which carries such lane over the stream called Day Brook upon the boundary which divides the said particular district of Saint John the Evangelist Carrington from the parish of Basford aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial

“of the dead in the Metropolis,” made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty’s Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

SAINT JOHN, REDHILL, SURREY.—Forthwith and entirely in Saint John’s Church, Redhill, Reigate; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves and earthen graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted, as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty’s Most Honourable Privy Council on the thirtieth day of June next :

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said thirtieth day of June.

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her

Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz. :—

In the Parish Churchyard of Dolwyddelen, in the county of Carnarvon, until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of Horsham St. Faith, in the county of Norfolk, until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six. *C. L. Peel.*
