*By Her Majesty's Command,*

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

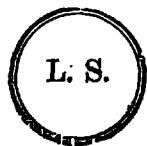

**BRISTOL (AVONMOUTH) LANDING-PLACE REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five approving of and defining a part of the Port of Bristol as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.

This Order may be cited as the BRISTOL (AVONMOUTH) LANDING-PLACE REVOCATION ORDER of 1896.

**BRISTOL (AVONMOUTH) FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF ORDER OF 1896.**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other

power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Bristol as a foreign animals wharf:
