TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEBN'S DRAWING ROOM.

By Her Majesty's Command, The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presenta-tion cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200. It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances

should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

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GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Order as to Duties of Stocktaker :--

Parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green ;--

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 6th day of May, 1875, We, the Local Government Board, made certain Regulations with regard to the appointment by Boards of Guardians of competent persons to perform the duties of Stocktakers at the Workhouses, Infirmaries, and Schools of certain Unions, Parishes, and Hamlet, including the Parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision in the matter should be made as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—In addition to the duties to be performed under the said Order dated the sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, by the Stocktaker appointed by the Guardians of the Poor of the said parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green, the said Stocktaker shall perform the following duties :—

- (1.) He shall compare the entries in the Inventories for the Workhouses and Schools of the Parish with the Invoices.
- (2.) He shall see that all goods received and which should be entered in the Inventory are so entered and are also entered on the Inventory Cards so long as the Guardians require the use of such Cards, and that such goods have been duly delivered to the Room, Ward, or other place for which they have been ordered.
- (3.) He shall compare the entries in the Clothing Books with the Invoices and see that the entries of the converted materials are duly transferred into the Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Book.
- (4.) He shall compare the entries in the Inventory of the offices of the Guardians with the Invoices.
- (5.) He shall report to the Guardians in all cases where goods are not duly posted in the Inventory or Inventory Cards.

ARTICLE II.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article I of this

Order the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of the Inventory in the following form :-

"Submitted to me this" day of 18 and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store. "(Signed)

" Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE III.-The Masters of the said Workhouses and the Superintendent of the said Schools shall, when required by the said Stocktaker to do so, submit to him the Inventories, Inventory Cards, and Stores referred to in Article I of this Order, and otherwise render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of the performance by him of the duties prescribed by Article I hereof.

ARTICLE IV.—The Masters of the Workhouses or the Superintendent of the Schools, as the case may be, shall lay every Account certified by the Stocktaker under Article II hereof before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of the said Certificate.

The French Government has given further notice, that on 6th May, 1896, tidal lights were exhibited from a metal tower, painted white, and situated on the extremity of Calais New East Pier :-

Calais East Pier Tidal Lights are fixed red, green and white lights, varied by red and green flashes, elevated 31 feet above high water, 20 feet above the pier, illuminating power, red light 16 becs Carcel (160 candles), green light 10 becs Carcel (100 candles), white light 81 becs Carcel (810 candles), red flush 50 becs Carcel (500 candles), and green flash 32 becs Carcel (320 candles), and in clear weather the lights will be visible from a distance of about 10 miles.

These signals are made as follows, and indicate by colour and flashes every 10 inches of rise after the tide has risen to a height of $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet above the level of the soundings on the chart.

When the tide is less than $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet above low. water datum, and rising, the light shows red; when less than $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet and falling, the light shows green; when between $6\frac{1}{3}$ and $7\frac{1}{4}$ feet, the light shows white.

With $7\frac{1}{4}$ feet and upwards the light shows white with groups of coloured flashes at intervals of eighty seconds. The flashes in each group are shown at intervals of five seconds, each red flash adding 3 feet 4 inches more to the initial height of $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet, and each green flash 10 inches more.

With a rising tide the fixed light, whether red or white, is eclipsed for a short period every l eighty seconds ; and, with a falling tide, the fixed light, white or green, is eclipsed twice in quick succession during the same period.

At or near high water, the light is not eclipsed. When the fixed white light is varied by groups of coloured flashes, the eclipses take place about the middle of the interval separating the groups.

Approximate position, lat. 50° 58' 20" N.,. long. 1° 50' 30" E.

On the same date the two temporary lights-(fixed green and fixed white), indicating the submerged portion of the East Pier, were discontinued.
