

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, under "The Sinking Fund Act, 1875," 38 and 39 Vic., c. 45, s. 8, that the sum of £600,000 will shortly be issued to the National Debt Commissioners, on account of the New Sinking Fund for the year 1896-97. IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk, I hereby make the following Order:—

The time-during which the taking and killing of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Suffolk shall be extended so as to be from the 1st March to the 1st September in each year.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 6TH JUNE 1896.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked to the extent in that Schedule mentioned.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the date of this revocation.
