Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if ther are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlair.' Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Davis Strait—Bell Buoy During Foggy Season.

THE United States Government has given notice that, on 23rd April, 1896, a bell buoy, painted red, with "O.C." in white letters on it, was moored in a depth of about 12 fathoms eastward of Old Cilley Ledge, in a position with Marshall Point Lighthouse bearing N. 3 W., distant 2 miles: and south-east extreme, Burnt Island, W.S.W.

Approximate position, lat. 43° 53′ 10" N., long. 69° 14' 30" W.

This buoy will be placed annually during the foggy season only, probably from April to October. [Variation 16° Westerly in 1896.]

No. 306.—IRELAND—WEST COAST. Killary Bay Approach - Dangers South-Eastward of Currickgaddy Rocks.

THE following information relating to the existence of dangers south-eastward of Carrickgaddy Rocks, approach to Killary Bay, found during a recent survey of the locality, has been received from Staff Captain W. F. Maxwell, R.N., in charge of West Coast of England

1. A rock, with a depth of 13 feet on it at low water, lies with the summit of Gaddymore, Carrickgaddy Rocks, bearing N. 31° W., distant 4 cables; and Dooaghtry Point Summit (140) N.

Approximate position, lat. 53° 38′ 10″ N., long. 9° 56′ 50″ W.

2. A shoal spot, with a depth of 6 fathoms on it, lies with Gaddymore bearing N. 8° E., distant 41 cables; and Inishdegilmore Summit (96) S. 74° E.

3. A rock, with a depth of 9 feet on it at low water, lies with the summit (96) of Inishdegilmore bearing S. 58° E., distant $3\frac{7}{10}$ cables; and Dooaghtry Point Summit (140) N. 52° E.

Two white, pyramidal beacons, each about

6 feet high, have been erected, one on the summit of Doonee Island, the other on the summit of Inishbarna, entrance to Killary Bay.

These beacons in line, bearing S. 59° E., lead

the dangers near Carrickgaddy Rocks, but close to the 6 fathoms spot mentioned above (2).
