REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the district and benefice of Hall Street Stockport in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said district and benefice of Hall Street Stockport is vested in the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the parish of Saint Mary Stockport in the said county of Chester and in the said diocese of Chester out of which parish the said district of Hall Street Stockport was partly formed.

"And whereas the Reverend William Symonds Clerk in Holy Orders now Rector or Incumbent of the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said district and benefice of Hall Street Stockport now vested in him as aforesaid as such Rector or Incumbent should be transferred to and be vested

in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Chester.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Francis John now Bishop of the said diocese of Chester is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary to the said Francis John Bishop of the said diocese of Chester has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas a sum of one thousand pounds has been paid over to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to be applied towards the cost of the erection of a suitable church for the said district and benefice of Hall Street Stockport and such sum has been so paid over upon condition that the transfer of the advowson of the same district and benefice which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed shall be effected.

"And whereas under the circumstances aforesaid it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said district and benefice of Hall Street Stockport which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the new parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the said district of Hall Street Stockport.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Symonds the Rector or Incumbent of the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport acting as such Rector or Incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Francis John Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal).

"We the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said district and benefice of Hall Street Stockport now vested in him the said William Symonds as such Rector or Incumbent of the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport as aforesaid shall be transferred from him the said William Symonds and from his successors Rectors or Incumbents of the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport to the said Francis John Bishop of the said diocese of Chester and to his successors Bishops of the same diocese and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Francis John Bishop of the said diocese of Chester and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved

by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty chapter eighty-six duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four and of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-six have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the new parish (some-time district chapelry) of Saint Martin, Castleton Moor within the original limits of the parish of Rochdale in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the above-mentioned new parish which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas certain glebe lands messuages tenements and hereditaments sometime belonging to the vicarage of the said parish of Rochdale have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the lastly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted will be permanently endowed under the provisions contained in the twelfth section of the said lastly-mentioned Act with an annual sum of two hundred pounds and such endowment will be secured by an instrument under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas Ellinor Kay of Harefield House Heywood, in the county of Lancaster, Spinster, has provided and conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, certain land as and for

a site for a church to be erected within and for the above proposed district when duly constituted and has also provided and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a part of a sum of two thousand pounds as a guarantee for the erection of the said proposed church.

“And whereas the Reverend Rathbone Hartley of Simpson Hill Heywood aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders, has provided and paid to the credit of our account as aforesaid the remaining and major part of the said sum of two thousand pounds.

“And whereas the said church site has been so conveyed and the said sum of two thousand pounds has been so provided and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district and when it shall have become a new parish then of the said new parish should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth.

“And whereas the said Ellinor Kay and the said Rathbone Hartley have nominated to us the person to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish should be assigned the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme all that part of the said new parish of Saint Martin, Castleton Moor which is described in the Schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of All Souls, Castleton.’ And with the like consent we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district of All Souls Castleton and when it shall have become a new parish then of the said new parish shall be assigned to and be vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester and his successors for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of All Souls, Castleton being:—

“All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Martin, Castleton Moor within the original limits of the parish of Rochdale in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the south-west partly by the new parish of Saint Mary Birch and partly by the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood both in the said county and diocese, upon the north-west partly by the last-named new parish partly by a certain detached portion of the parish of Middleton in the county and diocese aforesaid and partly by the new parish of Saint Michael Bamford in the same county and diocese, upon the north and upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Clement Spotland in the said county and diocese upon the east by the new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale in the said county

and diocese and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale from the new parish of Saint Martin, Castleton Moor aforesaid, at a point in the middle of Sudden Brook about three chains to the south-east of the south-eastern side of the building known as the Marland Dye Works and due north of the centre of the culvert which carries Bury-road over the stream called or known as Red Sea Brook and extending thence in a direction due south and in a straight line for a distance of six and a quarter chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the Reservoir situate to the west of Littlefields Cotton Mill) to the southern end of the said culvert on the southern side of Bury-road aforesaid and extending thence first southward and then south-westward to and along the middle of the said Red Sea Brook for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to the point at the southern corner of the close numbered two hundred and fourteen upon the map of the Ordnance Survey on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ scale published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and upon the map hereunto annexed where the said Red Sea Brook issues from a pipe or culvert and extending thence still south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of thirty-three chains or thereabouts (thereby passing to the south-east of Chamber House) to the point opposite to the north-eastern end of the buildings and premises called or known as France Hill where the road or footpath leading from the Plough Inn at Marland past Matthew Moss Farm branches into two roads or footpaths both leading into Chadwick-lane and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of the western branch of the same road or footpath for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chadwick-lane aforesaid and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point distant one mile in a direct line from Saint Luke's Church Heywood upon the boundary which divides the Local Board District of Castleton-by-Rochdale from the municipal borough of Heywood which boundary here coincides with the boundary between the Middleton and Heywood Parliamentary Divisions of South-East Lancashire as laid down in the seventh schedule to ‘The Redistribution of Seats Act 1885’ and extending thence southward along the said municipal and parliamentary boundary for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts (thereby passing between the house called or known as Heys and the house called or known as Wilderness) to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Martin Castleton Moor from the new parish of Saint Mary Birch aforesaid.”

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the new parish of Saint Martin Castleton Moor out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron has signified his assent to such scheme.

And whereas the Reverend Joseph Chadwick Bates the Incumbent of such new parish has offered certain objections to the said scheme,

And whereas notwithstanding such objections the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and

direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester. *C. WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her present Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the eighteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Beaufort situate partly in the county of Monmouth and partly in the county of Brecknock and wholly in the diocese of Llandaff.

“Whereas under the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the first day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six and published in the London Gazette on the first day of September following certain parts of the parishes of Aberystwith and of Bedwelty both in the said county of Monmouth and in the diocese of Llandaff aforesaid and of the parishes of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock and of Llangynidr both in the county of Brecknock and in the diocese of Saint David's were together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes which was called ‘The District of Beaufort,’ and the parts of the two last-named parishes so comprised within such district as aforesaid were transferred to and became, with the rest of the district a part of the said diocese of Llandaff.

“And whereas the said district of Beaufort has under the provisions of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Beaufort should be altered so as to include within its limits a certain additional part of the said parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock in the said county of Brecknock and in the diocese of Saint David's as aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consents of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Llandaff, and of the Right Reverend William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Beaufort shall be altered so as to include within its limits all that portion of the said parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink, and that from and after the same date and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the said parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock so to be included as aforesaid shall become annexed to and become and be and shall form part of the said new parish of Beaufort and shall also become and be and form part of the said diocese of Llandaff and shall be included in the rural deanery and archdeaconry in which the said new parish of Beaufort is comprised.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Beaufort situate partly in the county of Monmouth and partly in the county of Brecknock and wholly in the diocese of Llandaff being:—

“All that part of the parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock in the said county of Brecknock and in the diocese of Saint David's which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Llangynidr in the last-named county and diocese upon the south by the said new parish of Beaufort upon the east by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mary, Brynmawr in the said county of Brecknock and in the diocese of Saint David's aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Mary, Brynmawr from the parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock aforesaid at a point in the middle of the Clydach River near to and north-west of the house called Blaen-Clydach, and extending thence generally westward along the middle of the said river for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point where it flows out of the most northerly reservoir belonging to the Nant-y-glo Iron Works, and extending thence westward and in a straight line for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the northern part of the said reservoir) to the centre of the bridge called Pont ar Llwng which carries the road leading from Beaufort to Llangynidr over the stream which flows to and joins the Ebbw River on the southern side of the house called Carns and extending thence, that is from the said bridge in a direction due west and in a straight line for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the last-named river upon the boundary which divides the

said parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock from the parish of Llangynidr aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme of representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and the patrons of the new parish of Beaufort and the Incumbents of the said new parish of Beaufort and of the parish of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas Henry Charles FitzRoy Duke of Beaufort K.G. as the patron of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llangattwg otherwise Llangattock has offered certain objections to the proposed arrangements.

And whereas notwithstanding such objections the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said dioceses of Llandaff and of Saint David's respectively.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws "concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz.:-

In the Parish Churchyard of Downe, in the county of Kent, until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of Morthoe, in the county of Devon, until the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of Bellingham, in

the county of Northumberland, until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.
