The rate of speed to be observed in travelling

upon the tramway.

The distances at which carriages using the tramway shall be allowed to follow one after the other.

The stopping of carriages using the tramway.

The traffic on the road in which the tramway slaid.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any machine, engine, or carriage using any tramway laid down in Lytham - road within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a machine, engine, or car, and the term "person" shall include any body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding

seven miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a

less distance than 150 yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, every driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same, except on a gradient steeper than 1 in 25, for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, in the course of its journey, when required so to do by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.

5. Except at a passing place or a terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction

of two or more streets or roads.

6. Every driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road without there being sufficient free space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor

shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

8. No carriage shall be stopped for the purpose of delivering any goods or parcels except at such places or at such distances as the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses may from time to time

appoint or direct.

9. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues. Derbyshire.—(!.) An Area comprising the parishes of Beighton, Eckington, Staveley, Clown, Bolsover, Whittington, Newbold-cum-Dunston, Brimington, Tapton, Calow, Sutton-cum-Duckmanton, Temple Normanton, Hasland, Wingerworth, and North Wingfield, in the county of Derby, and also comprising the borough of Chesterfield (14 July, 1896).

(2.) An Area comprising the parishes of Alfreton, Ripley, Codnor-cum-Loscoe, Codnor Park, Heanor, Denby, Belper, Kilhourne, Holbrook, Horsley, Horsley Woodhouse, Smalley, Shipley, Mapperly, Stanley, and West Hallam, in the county of Derby, and also comprising the borough of Ilkeston (14 July, 1896).

Devonshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Alphington, and St. Thomas-the-Apostle, in the county of Devon (18 May, 1896).

Huntingdonshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Bury, and Rumsey, in the county of Huntingdon (21 April, 1896).

Leicestershire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Coalville, Swannington, and Whitwick, in the county of Leicester (29 June, 1896).

Lincolnshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Frodingham, and Scunthorpe, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire (21 April, 1896).

Oxfordshire.—An Area in the county of Oxford comprising the district of the Urban Council of Witney, and also comprising the parishes of Coggs, Crawley, Curbridge, Ducklington, and Hailey (12 May, 1896).

Staffordshire.—(1.) An Area comprising the parishes or townships of Bentley, Bilston, Darlaston, Wednesfield, and Willenhall, in the county of Stafford, and also comprising the boroughs of Walsall, and Wolverhampton (21 April, 1896).

(2.) An Area comprising the borough of Burton-upon-Trent (21 April, 1896).

Worcestershire.—An Area comprising the parish of Kidderminster Foreign, in the county of Worcester, and also comprising the borough of Kidderminster (21 April, 1896).
