THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Notice issued by the Russian Government, viz. :—

From the Gazette of the Odessa Prefecture of June 22nd (July 4th), 1896.

Egypt having been declared unsatisfactory in respect of cholera, all vessels arriving from Egyptian ports, as well as vessels entering the Mediterranean by way of the Suez Canal, shall be subjected to the operation of paragraph 17 of the Quarantine Regulations of the 26th April, 1893, as having sailed from infected ports, or having been in communication with the same. Ships, therefore, arriving at the port of Odessa, especially if they have hoisted the quarantine flag during their passage through the Mediterranean and the Straits shall, in accordance with paragraph 18 of such Regulations, be subjected to medical inspection of their crews, passengers, and ship's quarters, and, should hygienic conditions of the same prove unsatisfactory, careful disinfection shall be carried out.
