CEREMONIAL observed at the Marriage of HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS MAUD CHARLOTTE MARY VICTORIA, Daughter of THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES THE PRINCE AND PRINCESS OF WALES, with HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE CHRISTIAN FREDERIC CHARLES GEORGE WALDEMAR AXEL OF DENMARK, G.C.B., in the Private Chapel of Buckingham Palace, on Wednesday, the 22nd of July, 1896, at 12.30 o'clock.

Her Majesty's invited Guests arrived at the Pimlico entrance to the Palace at 11.30 o'clock, and were shown to their places in the Chapel by Her Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers.

The German Ambassador and other Family Ministers and Chargés d'Affaires invited were received by the Master of the Ceremonies and shown to the places reserved for them in the Chapel.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, the Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Bishop of Winchester (Clerk of the Closet), the Sub-Dean of the Chapels Royal (Rev. Edgar Sheppard, M.A.), the Rev. Canon F. A. J. Hervey, M.A., Chaplain to The Queen and Domestic Chaplain to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, and The Rev. J. F. Mitchell, Chaplain in Ordinary to The Queen and Honorary Chaplain to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, also arrived by the Pimlico Entrance and assembled in the Robing Room (the new Luncheon Room), and from thence were conducted to their places within the Altar Rails in the Chapel at 12 o'clock, a Voluntary being played on the Organ.

Her Highness The Princess Edward of Saxe-Weimar, Her Serene Highness The Princess Victor of Hohenlohe, and the Count Gleichen, and the Countesses Gleichen, Their Serene Highnesses The Prince and Princess Adolphus of Teck, and The Baron von Pawel-Rammingen, K.C.B., arrived at the Pimlico entrance, and were shown to their places by Her Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers.

His Royal Highness the Bridegroom with His Supporters, their Royal Highnesses The Prince Christian and The Prince Harold of Denmark, arrived from Marlborough House, accompanied by a Subaltern's Escort of Royal Horse Guards, under the command of Lieut. C. E. Rose, at the Grand Entrance to the Palace at 11.45 o'clock, and was conducted to the Ladies' Dining Room, where He remained until summoned for the Ceremony.

A Hymn ("O Paradise"—Lord Crofton) was sung as the Procession entered the Chapel.

The Band of the Grenadier Guards, under the direction of Lieutenant Dan Godfrey, which was stationed on the Terrace, played a March as each Procession passed up the Temporary Corridor.

The Service was performed by The Archbishop of Canterbury, who delivered a short Address.

The Bride was given away by Her Father, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G.

The Musical arrangements were under the direction of Sir Walter Parratt, Master of the Music, who presided at the Organ, assisted by Dr. Creser, Organist of Her Majesty's Chapel Royal, St. James's Palace.

The Gentlemen and the Choir of that Chapel performed the Musical part of the Service.

The Queen was then conducted by The Lord Steward privately, as on arrival, by the Lower Rooms and the upper part of the Marble Hall, to the Bow Library and 1844 Drawing Room, where Their Royal Highnesses The Bride and Bridegroom, and The Prince and Princess of Wales, with the other Members of The Royal Family, had previously arrived.

The officiating Clergy followed Her Majesty's Procession from the Chapel, and Her Majesty's Guests were afterwards shown to the Temporary Hall and Corridor.

After the Register of the Marriage had been completed, The Queen took leave of The Bride and Bridegroom and Royal Personages, and returned to Her Majesty's Private Apartments.

Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, with The Bride and Bridegroom, and other Royal Guests, and other Members of The Royal Family, then proceeded by the Ministers' Staircase and the Picture Gallery to the State Dining Room, where Luncheon was served. The Band of the Grenadier Guards performed a selection of music on the Terrace under the windows during Luncheon.

Luncheon was also served for Her Majesty's Guests in the Ball Room, when the same Toasts were given by the Lord Steward. Mr. Gottlieb's Vienna Orchestra performed a selection of music in the Ball Room during Luncheon.

After Luncheon Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales and The Bride and Bridegroom proceeded to the Picture Gallery, and received the congratulations of Her Majesty's Guests.

At 3.15 o'clock, The Bride and Bridegroom returned from the Grand Entrance at Buckingham Palace to Marlborough House, followed by Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales and Princess Victoria of Wales, and others of The Royal Family, with the combined Escorts of Royal Horse Guards, the Route being by Constitution Hill, Piccadilly, and St. James's Street.

Her Majesty's Royal Body Guard of Honourable Corps of Gentlemen-at-Arms were on duty in the Ante Room and Vestibule of the Chapel, under the command of Lord Belper, the Captain, and Colonel H. H. Oldham, the Lieutenant, Major P. L. Tillbrook, the Standard Bearer, and Colonel Aubone Fife, the Clerk of the Cheque and Adjutant, were on duty with the Corps.

The Royal Body Guard of Yeomen of the Guard were on duty in the Marble Hall and the Temporary Hall and Corridor, under the command of the Earl of Limerick, K.P., the Captain, and Colonel, R. G. Ellison, the Ensign, Colonel Reginald Hennell, D.S.O., the Clerk of the Cheque and Adjutant, and Major Hon. Frank Colborne, Exon in Waiting, were on duty with the Corps.

A Guard of Honour of 1st Battalion Scots Guards under the command of Brevet Major J. W. A. Drummond was mounted in the Quadrangle of Buckingham Palace.

The Route of the Procession, from Marlborough House by Marlborough Gate and the Central Avenue of the Mall to Buckingham Palace by the Centre Gates, was kept by Troops, under the command of Colonel Oliphant, Grenadier Guards.

The Route of the Return Procession from Buckingham Palace to Marlborough House was kept by Street Parties of the First Life Guards, under the command of Captain G. Carter.

Royal Salutes were fired on the Horse Guards Parade by a Battery of Royal Horse Artillery under the command of Major F. W. J. Eustace, and at the Tower of London under the command of Major E. Dawson, at the conclusion of the Ceremony.
