THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Notice issued by the Austro-Hungarian Government, of which the following is a copy,

Circular addressed by the Maritime Authorities to the Offices and Functionaries of the Port.

By a Decree of the 16th July, 1896, of the Ministry of the Interior, Trade, and Finances (B. L. T. No. 117) acting in concert with the Hungarian Government, and with reference to the present sanitary condition of Russia, the prohibition of importation and transit of certain goods from Russia, as detailed in the Decree of 3rd June, 1893 (B. L. T. No. 88), is rescinded.

Special Regulations (supplementary to the General Regulations issued 5th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 21 and 28, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. The Examination will be in the following subjects :-

1. Handwriting and Orthography.

2. Arithmetic.

3. English Composition.

4. Mathematics, pure and applied.

5. Land Surveying, including skill in enlarging and reducing Maps and Drawings.

6. Architectural Surveying and Valuing.

7. Elements of Geology and Chemistry. In subjects 5 and 6 there will be an oral and practical examination.

III. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

IV. A fee of £3 will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination, commencing on the 13th October, 1896, for the situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland, will be held in Dublin under the foregoing Regulations.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 25th September, an application, in the handwriting of the Candidate, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 11TH AUGUST 1896.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1994, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.
