## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 2ND OCTOBER 1896.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the

Diseases of Animals Act, 1891, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order, to the extent described in that Schedule, is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

TIMOR ISLAND.

Dilhi Harbour-Stanley Point (Lequebode Point) Light.

THE Portuguese Government has given notice, dated 10th September, 1896, that a light has been established on Stanley Point, Dilhi Harbour :-

Stanley (Lequebode) Point Light is fixed white, with red flashes every thirty seconds, elevated 65 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles, between the bearings E. through south and S. 51° W.

The lighthouse of masonry is a truncated cone surmounted by an octagonal iron framework, 65 feet high, painted in blue and white alternate

horizontal stripes.

The lighting apparatus is dioptric of the 4th order, and the power of the white light is equal to  $\epsilon 4$  becs Carcel or 640 candles, and the red flash 117 becs Carcel or 1,170 candles.
