Ministry of the Interior.—Royal Order.

(Translation.)

Whereas the existence of the bubonic pest at Bombay has been officially notified to this Ministry, and conformably to &c., &c., &c.

The King, &c., &c., has been pleased to order that vessels proceeding from the aforesaid port which have sailed after the 10th of September ultimo, and which, with any kind of bill of health, arrive at our ports after the publication of the present Royal Order, shall be despatched to the quarantine station. Other ports within 165 kilometres of Bombay, measured in a direct line, are to be considered specially compromised.
