A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday, the thirty-first day of October instant; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday, the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Given at Our Court at *Balmoral*, this twenty-sixth day of *October*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Our reign.

GOD save the QUEEN.

At the Court at *Balmoral*, the 26th day of *October*, 1896.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday, the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

BY virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define

"the time for proceeding to Election during the "Recess:"

I do hereby give notice, that the death of Henry Byron Reed, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Eastern Division of the Borough of Bradford, hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said Division of the said Borough, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
