### THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

The Local Government Act, 1894.

#### WAREHAM FAIRS.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Town Council of Wareham, that Fairs have been annually held in the borough of Wareham, in the county of Dorset, on the third Tuesday in April and the second Tuesday in September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should in future be held on the third Thursday in April and the second Thursday in September, in each year:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should in future be held on the third Thursday in April and the second Thursday in September in each year:

And whereas the Town Council of Wareham, as lord or owner of the said Fairs and the tolls thereof, have consented in writing that the said Fairs should in future be held on the third Thursday in April and the second Thursday in September in each year:

Now therefore I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers

vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the Fairs which have been annually held in the borough of Wareham, in the county of Dorset, on the third Tuesday in April and the second Tuesday in September, shall in future be held on the third Thursday in April and the second Thursday in September in each year.

### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 20TH NOVEMBER 1896.)

#### GLASGOW (SHIELDHALL) LANDING-PLACE REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered; as follows:

#### *Revocation of Order.*

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

#### *Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

#### *Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the GLASGOW (SHIELDHALL) LANDING-PLACE REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.
