“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mary Cowpen situate at Blyth as aforesaid.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edgar Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parochial chapelry of Horton which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be

assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Mary Cowpen situate at Blyth as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Blyth.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edgar Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Mary Cowpen situate at Blyth as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Blyth, being:—

"All that part of the parochial chapelry of Horton, in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle which is bounded upon the north-west, and upon the north east by the new parish of Cambois, in the said county and diocese, upon the east and upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Blyth in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Blyth from the parochial chapelry of Horton aforesaid at a point in the middle of the line of the Blyth and Tyne Railway opposite to the mile post indicating a distance of one mile and a quarter from Blyth, and extending thence north-westward and in a straight line for a distance of fifty two chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of the footpath leading from Malvin's Close to Cowpen with the footpath leading from Red House into the road leading from Newcastle to Blyth, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road leading from Newcastle to Blyth and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the footpath leading to the Old Alkali Works and to Bucks Hill upon the south bank of the river Blyth and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction upon the south bank of the said river with the footpath leading to Cowpen, and extending thence due north-westward and in a straight line for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the boundary in the middle of the said river which divides the said parochial chapelry of Horton from the new parish of Cambois aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her

said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Francis John Bishop of the said diocese of Chester acting under and in pursuance of the Acts hereinbefore mentioned has submitted to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England a plan bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six for consolidating into one benefice the said office or place of preacher in the said parish of Bunbury and the said vicarage or office of curate of the same parish in the manner in the said plan appearing and for making certain other arrangements which are likely in the opinion of the said Bishop and in our opinion to promote the efficient discharge of the pastoral duties in the said parish of Bunbury.

"And whereas the said plan (as by the same appears) has the consent of the Master and four Wardens of the Art and Mystery of Haberdashers in the city of London the patrons of the office or place of preacher in the said parish of Bunbury and also of the vicarage or office of the same parish and of the Reverend William Alfred Edwards, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present vicar or curate of the said parish of Bunbury.

"And whereas the office or place of preacher in the said parish of Bunbury is now vacant.

"And whereas the said plan is in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"To the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England:—

"I, Francis John, Lord Bishop of Chester, under and by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen section seventy-two and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of her said Majesty chapter ninety-four,

section nine have with the consent of the Master and four Wardens of the Art and Mystery of Haberdashers in the city of London patrons of the office or place of preacher in the parish of Bunbury in the county and diocese of Chester and also of the vicarage or office of curate of the same parish testified as hereinafter is mentioned framed the following plan for effecting the consolidation of the benefice of the said office or place of preacher and the benefice of the said vicarage into one benefice and for making other arrangements such as I judge likely to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in the parish of Bunbury aforesaid which said plan being a plan framed so as not to prejudice the interest of any existing incumbent I do hereby submit for consideration by you, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and request that the same may be carried into effect as in the said Acts is provided.

“Whereas under and by virtue of the authority given by Royal Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth dated at Westminster the second day of January in the thirty-sixth year of Her Reign Thomas Aldersey, Citizen and Haberdasher of London, did in or about the year one thousand five hundred and ninety-four out of the rectory of Bunbury in the county of Chester belonging to him found and endow in the parish of Bunbury aforesaid a benefice denominated and known as the office or place of preacher in the parish of Bunbury and also another benefice denominated and known as the vicarage or curacy of the same parish. And whereas the said parish of Bunbury contains only one church being the parish church thereof. And whereas the respective incumbents of the said two benefices which are held in severalty have since the foundation of the same benefices executed the office of an incumbent within one and the same church namely in the parish church of Bunbury aforesaid and within no other church and the profits and spiritual charge of the said parish and church are divided between the said two incumbents. And whereas the endowments of the said preacher of the said parish consist of a house known as the Preacher's House or rectory of Bunbury and certain glebe lands thereto belonging situate in the township of Bunbury in the said parish containing altogether with the site of the said house and its appurtenances twenty-eight acres three roods and twenty-four perches in statute measure or thereabouts and of a stipend or annual sum of sixty-six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence payable in respect and out of the rectorial tithe rent charge of the said parish of Bunbury. And whereas the endowments of the vicar or curate of the said parish consist of a house known as the Vicarage of Bunbury and certain glebe land thereto belonging situate in the said township and parish containing altogether with the site of the said last-mentioned house and its appurtenances ten acres in statute measure or thereabouts a stipend or annual sum of twenty pounds payable in respect and out of the rectorial tithe rent charge of the said parish a rent charge of fourteen pounds a year payable out of and charged upon certain lands in the said township and parish of Bunbury aforesaid the sum of one thousand three hundred and one pounds one shilling and three pence held in trust for the benefit of the said vicar or curate by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation of the maintenance of the poor clergy and of the surplice and other fees payable to the minister at the said parish church of Bunbury aforesaid which said fees on an average

of the last three years have amounted to twenty pounds a year or thereabouts. And whereas the jurisdiction and control of the said preacher and vicar of Bunbury within the said parish church and parish are undefined and have for a long time been found most inconvenient and it is most desirable that the said benefices of preacher and vicar as aforesaid shall be consolidated so as to form one benefice to be held by one incumbent and that by such consolidation better provision will be made for the spiritual duties of the said parish. And whereas the benefice of preacher of the said parish of Bunbury is now vacant by the avoidance thereof of the Reverend William Clark, Clerk, Master of Arts, late Incumbent thereof. And whereas the Reverend William Alfred Edwards, Clerk, Master of Arts, is now the vicar or curate of the said parish church and parish of Bunbury and he is satisfied and doth admit by his signing and sealing this plan that the same will not prejudice nor affect the interests of him as existing incumbent of the said vicarage or curacy. Now I the said Francis John Bishop of Chester with the consent of the said Master and four Wardens of the Art and Mystery of Haberdashers testified by their Common Seal being hereunto affixed and of the said William Alfred Edwards testified as aforesaid do propose :—

“That the said benefice and office or place of preacher of Bunbury aforesaid shall be forthwith consolidated with the said benefice of the vicarage and curacy of Bunbury aforesaid into one benefice to be held by one and the same incumbent.

“That the said intended consolidated benefice shall be called and known as the vicarage of the church and parish of Bunbury and the incumbent thereof shall be designated vicar of the vicarage and parish church of Bunbury and shall have entire and exclusive cure of souls within the said parish of Bunbury with all rights powers and jurisdiction as well of a vicar or incumbent of the said parish as also all such rights powers and jurisdiction in the said parish as heretofore hath belonged to as well the preacher of the said parish of Bunbury as the vicar or curate thereof under the authority of the hereinbefore mentioned Letters Patent or any grant statute ordinance or direction made in pursuance thereof including the right or power of constituting and being one of the governors of the possessions and revenues purchased and assigned by the said Thomas Aldersey for the maintenance of the Free Grammar School and preacher of the Divine Word and the relief of the poor in the said parish of Bunbury and shall be subject to the laws provisions and regulations as to presentation and appointment and as to institution collation and induction (save as hereinafter is expressed and provided) and as to holding benefices and to all such jurisdiction of the Bishop or other jurisdiction as are by law now or hereafter shall be applicable to a vicarage or benefice with cure of souls and to the vicar or incumbent thereof and to all statutes ordinances and directions now obligatory upon the preacher or vicar or curate of the said parish of Bunbury.

“That the endowments of the said intended consolidated benefice to be called the vicarage of the church and parish of Bunbury shall be the said house and glebe lands of the preacher of Bunbury the house and glebe lands of the vicar or curate of Bunbury the stipends respectively payable to the said preacher and vicar or curate in respect and out of the rectorial rent charge of Bunbury and the rent charge sums of money and fees and all other endowments now payable or held in trust for or otherwise belonging to the

benefice or vicar or curate of Bunbury or either of them.

"That the advowson of or right of presentation of a minister or incumbent to the church and vicarage of Bunbury when the said consolidation of benefices shall have been made shall (subject as hereinafter is expressed and provided) be vested in the said Master and four Wardens of the Art and Mystery of Haberdashers in the city of London.

"That the said William Alfred Edwards or other the vicar or curate for the time being of the said parish of Bunbury shall immediately upon the said intended consolidation of benefices taking effect as aforesaid become and be the vicar or incumbent of the said intended consolidated benefice and vicarage of Bunbury without any presentation institution or induction or other process whatsoever subject nevertheless to all engagements and liabilities (if any) affecting the benefices so consolidated and the incumbents respectively thereof at the time of such consolidation.

"That as soon as conveniently may be after the consolidation of the said benefices into one benefice as aforesaid all practicable steps shall be taken to effect a sale under the provisions of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter fifty-seven or other statutory authority in that behalf then existing of the house and glebe lands situate at Bunbury aforesaid of the preacher of Bunbury which as aforesaid are to become and form part of the endowments of the said intended consolidated benefice and vicarage of Bunbury.

**FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS,
1878 to 1895.**

WHEREAS by Section 8 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted that :—

“ Where the Secretary of State certifies that in his opinion any machinery or process or particular description of manual labour used in a factory or workshop (other than a domestic workshop) is dangerous or injurious to health, or dangerous to life or limb, either generally or in the case of women, children, or any other class of persons, or that the provision for the admission of fresh air is not sufficient, or that the quantity of dust generated or inhaled in any factory or workshop is dangerous or injurious to health, the Chief Inspector may serve on the occupier of the factory or workshop a notice in writing, either proposing such special rules or requiring the adoption of such special measures as appear to the Chief Inspector to be reasonably practicable and to meet the necessities of the case.”

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby certify that in my opinion the process of vulcanizing India-rubber by means of bisulphide of carbon, and the processes incidental thereto, are dangerous or injurious to health.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 3RD DECEMBER 1896.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The holding of markets and of public and other sales or exhibitions of swine, fat or store, within the borough of Lewes is hereby prohibited.

2. If a market or a public or other sale or an exhibition of swine, fat or store, is held in the borough of Lewes aforesaid in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or sale or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each pig exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any pig, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or sale or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.
