THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL ACT, 1865.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Refsö Fiard Approach—Sunken Rock marked by Buoy.

INFORMATION has been received, dated 25th November, 1896, of the existence of a small rock, named Holby, with a depth of 16 feet on it, situated on the western side of the fairway, south-westward of Kallo Lighthouse, southern entrance to Refsö Fiard.

(1.) Alderney—Lloyd's Signal Station Established.

INFORMATION has been received from Lloyd's that a signal station has been established at Alderney.

This station is situated on the brow of Butes Hill, southward of Grosnez Point, in a position with St. Anne's Church bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., distant 400 yards; and Plate Saline Battery N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

No. 710.—UNITED STATES—MAINE.

(1.) *Gloucester Harbour Approach—Ledge Southward of Norman's Woe.*

THE United States Government has given notice of the existence of a rocky ledge, now named Popplestone Ledge, extending about S.S.E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the coast westward of Norman's Woe; the least depth on it is 6 feet, situated at its extremity, from which Eastern Point Light-house bears E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant $1\frac{5}{8}$ miles; and Norman's Woe Point about N.E. by E.

There are depths of 5 to 6 fathoms close to the ledge.

(2.) *Salem Harbour Approach—Rocks Westward of Kettle Island.*

LIBERIA.

Shoal Southward of Baddu Point.

INFORMATION has been received from Messrs. Elder, Dempster, and Co., that the Master of their steam-vessel "Boma" reports having touched on a shoal of about 4 fathoms, with 9 fathoms close to, in a position with Castle Rock bearing E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., distant $1\frac{3}{8}$ miles; and Baddu Point N. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.; or approximately in lat. 4° 38' 45" N., long. 8° 26' 45" W. The village of Sess Town is abreast of this position.

There was a heavy swell at the time, but no breakers were observed in the vicinity of the shoal, although possibly there may be less water.

A danger line has been drawn in the chart round the above 4 fathoms and the 5 fathoms situated about three-quarters of a mile eastward of it.

INCOME TAX.
