THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Notices respecting quarantine issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :-

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 197 of 5th December, 1896, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:-

1. Any shipment of cattle, any part of which is found to be suffering or to be suspected of suffering time of arrival or after a period of inspection, is to be detained in quarantine.

2. Should the existence of cattle-plague be verified before landing, the cargo will not be allowed to land.

- 3. The importation of cattle of any kind from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria, Sicily, Syria (including Alexandretta), and Salonica, is prohibited, and the introduction into these islands of wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from the above places and from countries where epidemic diseases are prevailing is likewise prohibited.
- 4. Cattle intended for importation into these islands must be accompanied by a certificate stating the place of their origin and the fact that cattle disease has not prevailed in that place (with as far as can be ascertained the route followed from any inland station to the port of embarkation), during the three months previous to the date of embarkation. Such certificate shall be given by the British Consular Authority at the places of origin and embarkation, or if there be no such British Consular Authority, by the Local Government Authority of the places of origin and embarkation.
- 5. Vessels arriving in this island, having on board more than 100 head of cattle (horses not being included) are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the lazaretto.
- 6. The importation of cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, Roumelia and Algeria, not otherwise prohibited, may be permitted subject to the undermentioned conditions; provided that, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, such cattle are not affected with disease so that they may be admitted in the lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the Island:

(a.) Cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, and Roumelia shall only be admitted to the enclosures which may be assigned or approved for that purpose at the lazaretto, and they shall be subjected to isolation and observation, for three months, and those from Algeria for fifteen days.

"(b.) Application must be made for leave to import and permission is to be obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment, stating the approximate number of the animals intended to be shipped. No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from Government and agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established.

(c.) The application referred to in the preceding article shall imply that the applicant has consented to pay the usual fees for entrance into the lazaretto and for guards and extraordinary expenses on each head of cattle, besides 2s. 6d. on each head of cattle per month or part thereof in cases in which it is found necessary to keep cattle in the lazaretto for a longer period than 15 days.

(d) That such cattle, if slaughtered at the lazaretto, will be subject to the regulations which may from time to time be made by the Port Authorities.

(c.) The owners of cattle in the lazaretto shall be subjected to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from time to time be made by the Port Authorities.

The importation, however, of horses, mules, and asses from Odessa is prohibited.

7. Swine arriving from Albania and Greece may be imported subject to 20 days' quarantine at the lagaretto or in private pens, and to any restrictions which the Chief Government Medical Officer may consider necessary.

8. The importation of dogs is subjected to three months' quarantine.

Government Notice (No. 2).

Hrs Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 211 of 24th December, 1896, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:—

1. Vessels to stop outside the Harbour with permission for coaling under such restrictions

as may in each case be directed by the

Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs; and shall in all cases be ordered to quit with all despatch after coaling.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had within seven days, cases of cholers, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholers;

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East;
(c.) Vessels from North or South America
when cases of yellow fever have occurred on
board during the voyage, unless such vessels have
been properly disinfected at an intermediate port
in Europe;

(d.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea which have not been admitted to free

pratique at Suez and Port Said;

(e.) Vessels on which a case of plague or disease resembling plague is reported to have occurred, within 21 days, unless such vessels and the crew thereof have in the interval been properly disinfected at Suez or at a Mediterranean port.

Quarantine for two days to be reckoned from the day of arrival with permission for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of 2 days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to two days' quarantine, viz.:—

Vessels arriving from any Indian Port.

 Quarantine for seven days to be reckoned from the commencement of the voyage with permission for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of seven days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the direction of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to seven days' quarantine,

Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health.

4. Other precautionary measures to be adopted when necessary.

Vessels arriving at this port having on board cases of scarlet fever, measles, or small-pox will be subject to such precautionary measures as the Head of the Government may deem necessary.

The luggage and clothing of passengers arriving from India are to be landed for disinfection at

the lazaretto.

Any person arriving in a vessel from an Indiau Port or from Candia with symptoms of fever is to be landed at the lazaretto and to be kept there under observation for seven days.

5. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

6. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers, arriving by any vessel subject to quarantine, are required to undergo the same quarantine restrictions as the vessels on which

they arrive.

- (b.) Passengers arriving on vessels having a duly qualified Medical Officer on board, are to be allowed to land without medical inspection, provided that the Medical Officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of cholera, or of any disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera either among the passengers or the crew. The declaration above referred to shall be countersigned by the master of the vessel.
 - 7. Goods.

(a.) The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

(b.) All goods from India are to be landed for

disinfection at the lazaretto.

(c.) The importation of rags is prohibited.

(d.) The importation; before disinfection, of goods from India, of soiled wearing apparel, or bedding material that is not new; is prohibited.

(e.) The importation of vines, vine shoots, fruit packed in vine leaves, or roots from any port of

the Mediterranean is prohibited:

(f) The importation of grapes, poles, or supports used in the cultivation of vines and plants, vegetable earth, vegetable or mixed manure, is prohibited unless the importation is accompanied by a sworn declaration, made by the shipper before the British Consular Authority of the place of its origin, to the effect that the shipment does not contain vine plants or cuttings, or that its contents come from nurseries, hothouses, fields or gardens which are at least 100 yards distant from the nearest vines or vineyards, and that moreover the Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

(g.) Provided, however, that the Collector of Customs may grant permission for the importation of plants, cuttings of the American vine, and vegetable produce under proper restrictions when application has been made and the precautions necessary are established before the shipment

leaves the place of origin.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Brindisi, enclosing the following quarantine regulations issued by the Italian Government, viz.:—

Ministry of the Interior.

Maritime Sanitary Order No. 4.

The Minister of the Interior having ascertained that the bubonic plague prevails in India and other Asiatic regions:

Seen, the laws for safeguarding public health (Articles 49 and 50).

Heard, the opinion of the Superior Council of Health:

Decrees: -

ART. 1. All ships coming from countries on the other side of the Straits of Bal-el-Mandeb prior to admission to free pratique shall undergo a medical inspection of all persons on board, and the disinfection of all effects for personal and domestic use which are not found to be perfectly clean. Besides, the following conditions must be complied with:—

1. Vessels having a doctor on board and a disinfecting stove, will be admitted to free pratique,

on the doctor declaring on oath :-

(a.) That no personal or domestic effects, or baggage were laden by the vessels, except what had been previously washed and disinfected, and that the articles themselves were accurately washed and disinfected on board.

(b.) That at the departure, and during the voyage, no certain case, and not even a suspected case, of bubonic plague has been detected on

board.

2. Vessels having a doctor on board, and also a disinfecting stove, who, at the departure, or during the voyage, have had cases of bubonic plague, will be admitted to free pratique when it is proved that nine days have passed since the death or complete recovery of the persons affected, and the ship's doctor declares on oath that the disinfection of all objects belonging to the affected persons, those who attended them, and those who came in contact with them, and also the space in which they were treated, has been carried out.

3. Vessels which have a doctor on board, but no disinfecting stove, on which at departure, and during the voyage, no case of suspected case of bubonic plague has occurred, may be admitted to free pratique when it results from the doctor's sworn declaration that no effects either for personal or domestic had been embarked which had not previously been washed and disinfected.

4. Vessels which have neither doctor nor disinfecting stove, but on board which at the departure and during the voyage no case or suspected case of bubonic plague has appeared may be admitted to free pratique after the medical inspection, the disinfection and such other measures as the Sanitary Authorities deem opportune to assure themselves of the perfect salubrity of the vessel.

5. Vessels which have a doctor on board but are unprovided with a disinfecting stove, if on board at the departure and during the voyage cases of bubonic plague have occurred may be admitted to free pratique when at least fourteen days have clapsed since the death or complete recovery of the persons affected, and the doctor of the ship declares on oath, that the chemical disinfection of the effects, articles, and places has been effected as at paragraph No. 2.

ART. 2. Vessels which have no doctor nor disinfecting stove and which find themselves to be in the conditions of Article 1, paragraph 5, having had cases of bubonic plague on board more than 14 days prior to arrival, shall be sent to one of the lazarettos of the Kiugdom (Asinara, Poveglia, Augusta), to be there detained, the time necessary for the disinfection and for the complete resanita-

tion of the vessel to be assured.

ART. 3. Vessels which have cases of bubonic plague, and have had cases during the voyage not less than nine days prior to arrival, shall without exception be directed to one of the lazarettos, to undergo such treatment as shall be ordered by the Ministry of the Interior.

ART. 4. Vessels arriving from regions beyond the Straits of Bab-el-Mandeb are prohibited from landing raw hides, fresh or dry, wool, horsehair, animals, or parts of animals of any

kind, and rags.

ART. 5. When bales of cotton are in question or merchandise not susceptible of disinfection, the Sanitary Authorities will permit it to be landed, advising the Prefect of the Province, with indications of the town and name of receiver of goods by telegraph.

The present revokes the telegraphic order of the 2nd October last, and the Maritime Order,

No. 3, of the 11th December last.

The Prefects of Maritime Provinces, the Capitaneries and Offices of Ports, of the Kingdom are charged with the execution of the present Order.

Selker Light-vessel—Alteration in Position.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 584

of 1896 :-

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 23rd December, 1896, that Selker Light-vessel has been moved 2 miles, N.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., from her previous position, into a depth of about 12 fathoms at low water.

3° 33' 40' W.
