

from landing raw hides, fresh or dry, wool, horsehair, animals, or parts of animals of any kind, and rags.

ART. 5. When bales of cotton are in question or merchandise not susceptible of disinfection, the Sanitary Authorities will permit it to be landed, advising the Prefect of the Province, with indications of the town and name of receiver of goods by telegraph.

The present revokes the telegraphic order of the 2nd October last, and the Maritime Order, No. 3, of the 11th December last.

The Prefects of Maritime Provinces, the Capitaineries and Offices of Ports, of the Kingdom are charged with the execution of the present Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
