## REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, inclosing the following Notice respecting the increase of quarantine against Bombay in Turkish ports:—  
Telegramme Circulaire aux Offices de Santé en date du Janvier 25-6, 1897.

Par décision du Conseil Supérieur de Santé les navires avec pèlerins provenant de l'Indoustan,

y compris Kurachee, subiront une quarantaine de quinze jours au lazaret, avec désinfection très rigoureuse des effets, hardes et bagages des pèlerins, lesquels seront débarqués, ainsi que des marchandises susceptibles. Cependant les soieries et les objets neufs seront simplement exposés à l'air et au soleil.

Les navires de mêmes provenance sur lesquels des cas de peste se seraient manifestés pendant la traversée ou à l'arrivée au lazaret, auront la faculté de retourner, avec les pèlerins qu'ils y auraient amenés, dans leur pays d'origine. Dans le cas contraire navire et pèlerins subiront une quarantaine de 20 jours à partir du dernier cas de peste. Ces navires seront en outre déchargés complètement de leur marchandise laquelle subira une désinfection rigoureuse. Les objets suspects appartenant aux pèlerins seront incinérés ainsi que tous les effets ayant appartenu à des personnes mortes de la peste.

Vu l'avis du comité de direction des services de l'hygiène,

Décète :

ART. 1er. Est interdite jusqu'à nouvel ordre l'importation en France et en Algérie des drilles, chiffons, linges de corps, hardes, vêtements portés et objets de literie ayant servi (non transportés comme bagages), ainsi que des cuirs verts, peaux fraîches, débris frais d'animaux, onglons, sabots venant de Bombay ou de toute autre localité des Indes où la peste aurait été constatée.

ART. 2. Est également interdit le transit à travers la France ou l'Algérie des objets désignés à l'article 1er, toutes les fois que ce transit donne lieu à un débarquement ou à une manipulation quelconque.

ART. 3. Est rapporté le décret du 15 Janvier 1897.

ART. 4. Le ministre de l'intérieur et le ministre des finances sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret,

qui sera inséré au Bulletin des lois et publié au Journal Officiel.
