TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 1st proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £1,300,000, in replacement of Bills paid off on the 27th June last.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 5th February, 1897, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 5th May or 5th August next, or 5th February, 1898, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 2nd proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Friday, the 5th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

No. 47.—MEDITERRANEAN—GREECE.

(1.) *Andros—Light on Tourliti.*

THE Hellenic Government has given notice that, on 13th January, 1897, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Tourliti, Port Kastro:—

Tourliti Light is a fifth order, dioptric, fixed white light, elevated 54 feet above the sea, 21 feet above the ground, and visible from N. 69° E., through east and south, to N. 56° W. (235°) a distance of 12 miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse is cylindrical in shape.

Approximate position, lat. 37° 50' 25" N., long. 24° 57' 20" E.
