In the Matter of WILLIAM CHARLES RULE Deceased.  
To the Next of Kin of John Rule and James Rule.

PURSUANT to an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice made in the matter of the estate of William Charles Rule deceased Crook v. Willson 1896 R. 1780 an enquiry is directed as follows:—Who were the persons entitled by virtue of or according to the Statute for the Distribution of Intestates' Estates to the personal estate of the testator living at his death and whether any of them have since died and if so who are their respective legal personal representatives. A further enquiry is directed by the said Order as follows:—Who is the person meant and intended by the said William Charles Rule by the description in his said will "William James Rule the son of my brother James now residing at Kooringa in Australia" and whether he survived the said William Charles Rule and if so whether he is living or dead and if dead who are his legal personal representatives.

William Charles Rule the testator was a Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Judicature England and died on the 2nd May 1895.

The above named John Rule was a brother of the testator and was born on the 13th June 1812 and died at Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire, England on the 20th April 1846. He is supposed to have been married to a person whose name is believed to have been Elizabeth Miller. She died on the 12th December 1865 leaving a child known as Harry Miller or Harry Rule Miller who is believed to have emigrated to Melbourne, Australia about the year 1858.

The above named James Rule was another brother of the testator. He was born on the 5th September 1814 and emigrated in the "Thirties" to Tasmania. He was in business as a Coachmaker and Wheelwright in partnership with Henry Standage or Clark at Launceston Tasmania in 1837. Henry Standage or Clark died in 1837 and James Rule subsequently married his widow whose Christian name was Agnes. James Rule was in England in 1847 and returned to Launceston Tasmania in 1849 or 1850 and from there went to Kooringa Burra South Australia. His wife Agnes left him between the years 1847 and 1850 and he subsequently married again in 1860.

The persons claiming to be next of kin according to the Statute for the Distribution of Intestates' Estates of the said William Charles Rule living at the time of his death or to be the legal personal representative of such of the next of kin as are now dead and the person claiming to be meant and intended by the testator by the description in his will as "Wm. James Rule the son of my brother James now residing at Kooringa in Australia" are by their Solicitors on or before the first day of July 1897 to come in and enter their claims at the chambers of Mr. Justice Stirling at the Royal Courts of Justice or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded from the benefit of the said Order.
