

9. Lessors to have power to require or sanction use of electric or other new motive power; and in case of such requirement or sanction to provide the necessary equipment on certain specified terms; and, lessees to provide the necessary rolling stock.

10. Proviso for re-entry on non-payment of rent or non-observance of covenants; and

11. Proviso for arbitration in case of dispute.
