Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

28 Janvier, 1897.

Le Président de la République française.

Sur le rapport des ministres de l'intérieur et des finances.

Vu la loi du 3 Mars, 1822.

Vu le décret du 4 Janvier, 1896, portant règlement de police sanitaire maritime,

Décrète :

Art. 1er. A partir de la promulgation du présent décret, aucune marchandise provenant directement ou indirectement de Bombay, de Kurrachee ou de toute autre localité où l'existence de la peste aura été constatée, ne pourra pénétrer en France ou en Algérie que par un des ports suivants : Marseille, Pauillac, Saint-Nazaire, le Havre, Dunkerque et Alger.

Art. 2. Tout colis contenant des linges de corps, ayant servi ou n'ayant pas servi, des hardes ou vêtements ayant servi ou n'ayant pas servi, objets de literie ayant servi ou n'ayant pas servi, des tapis, vieux ou neufs, ou toute marchandise consistant en drilles, chiffons, cuirs verts, peaux fraîches, débris frais d'animaux, onglons, sabots, ayant quitté après le 5 Février un des ports de l'Océan Indien autre que ceux reconnus contaminés de peste, depuis Mascate, y compris les ports du golfe Persique, jusqu'au cap Comorin, sera accompagné d'un certificat d'origine visé par un agent consulaire français.

Art. 3. Les infractions aux dispositions qui précèdent seront punies des peines prévues par la loi du 3 Mars, 1822.

Art. 4. Le présent décret sera publié et affiché ainsi que la loi du 3 Mars, 1822, dans tous les ports de France.

Art. 5. Le ministre de l'intérieur et le ministre des finances sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera inséré au Bulletin des lois et publié au Journal officiel.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Notice issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :—

No. 21.—Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 20 of 23rd January, 1897, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :—

1. Vessels not allowed to enter the Harbour or to communicate with the Island.

Vessels coming directly or indirectly from an Indian Port.

2. Vessels to stop outside the Harbour with permission for coaling under such restrictions as

may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the Harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs; and shall in all cases be ordered to quit with all despatch after coaling.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage cases of cholera, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera;

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East;

(c.) Vessels from North or South America when cases of yellow fever have occurred on board during the voyage, unless such vessels have been properly disinfected at an intermediate port in Europe;

(d.) Vessels arriving from Arabian Ports in the Red Sea which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said;

(e.) Vessels on which a case of plague or any disease resembling plague is reported to have occurred during the voyage.

3. Vessels not allowed to enter the Harbour or to communicate with any portion of these Islands, but allowed on and after the 6th of February to communicate with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto.

Vessels mentioned in paragraphs (a) (b) (c) (d) and (e) of Head 2; and

Vessels arriving directly or indirectly from India and not having had any case of plague or of any illness resembling plague.

Passengers arriving by any vessel mentioned under this head, may be landed at Comino to undergo strict quarantine for 21 days from the date of arrival.

All clothing and linen belonging to passengers will be thoroughly disinfected during the established period of quarantine.

Vessels may be allowed to coal, by means of their own crew, at the Island of Cominotto.

4. Quarantine for seven days to be reckoned from the commencement of the voyage with permission for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of seven days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to seven days' quarantine, viz. :

Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health which do not fall under any of the preceding regulations.

5. Other precautionary measures to be adopted when necessary.

Vessels arriving at this port having on board cases of scarlet fever, measles, or small-pox will be subject to such precautionary measures as the Head of the Government may deem necessary.

Any person arriving in a vessel from Candia with symptoms of fever is to be landed at the lazaretto and to be kept there under observation for seven days.

6. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

7. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers arriving by any vessel subject to quarantine are required to undergo the same quarantine restrictions as the vessels on which they arrive.

(b.) Passengers arriving on vessels having a duly qualified medical officer on board, are to be allowed to land without medical inspection, pro-

vided that the medical officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of cholera, plague, or of any disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera or plague, either among the passengers or the crew. The declaration above referred to shall be countersigned by the master of the vessel.

(c.) Passengers arriving from Mediterranean Ports must, before landing, declare on oath that they have not been in India for the last 30 days. All passengers who have been during the last 30 days in India shall, before being allowed to land in free pratique, undergo a strict medical visit and disinfection at the lazaretto under such restrictions as will be ordered by the Port Authorities.

8. Goods.

(a.) The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

(b.) The importation of rags is prohibited.

(c.) The importation is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, viz., soiled wearing apparel, bedding materials, hides, feathers, leather, bones, and jute goods.

(d.) The importation of vines, vine shoots, fruit packed in vine leaves, or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited.

(e.) The importation of grapes, poles, or supports used in the cultivation of vines and plants, vegetable earth, vegetable or mixed manure, is prohibited unless the importation is accompanied by a sworn declaration, made by the shipper before the British Consular Authority of the place of its origin, to the effect that the shipment does not contain vine plants or cuttings, or that its contents come from nurseries, hothouses, fields or gardens which are at least 100 yards distant from the nearest vines or vineyards, and that moreover the Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

(f.) Provided, however, that the Collector of Customs may grant permission for the importation of plants, cuttings of the American vine, and vegetable produce under proper restrictions when application has been made and the precautions necessary are established before the shipment leaves the place of origin.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome enclosing a Decree issued by the Italian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz.:—

DECREE.

ART. 1. Article 4 of the Ordinance of the 29th of December, 1896, will be applied only to ships coming from the ports of Hindustan, and to those of different provinces which have touched there, excepting in those cases where the merchandise specified in Article 4 which has been embarked on these latter vessels in the ports of Hindustan has been stored in places specially set aside for it and has been kept separate from that embarked in the preceding ports.

ART. 2. With regard to sending ships to the sanitary stations, when it is necessary, they will be obliged for the present to put in at Asinara, until some other station shall be designated, when occasion shall arise.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces, Port Captains and other officials are charged with the execution of the present Ordinance.
