NOTICES TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 68 to 70 of the year 1897.)

[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning
the visibility of lights are given from seaward.]

No. 68.—SOUTH AMERICA—EAST
COAST.

(1.) *Bahia Blanca—Alterations in Positions of
Buoys and Light-vessel.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 420
of 1894:—

Information has been received that the under-
mentioned alterations have been made in the
positions of the light-vessel and certain buoys at
the entrance to Bahia Blanca (Port Belgrano):—
a. The light-vessel has been moved about
N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., a distance of $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles, and is
now moored with Mount Hermoso bearing
N. 17° W., distant about 12 miles.

Approximate position on Chart No. 1329,
lat. 39° 10' S., long. 61° 38' W.

b. No. 1 Buoy has been moved N. 45° W., a
distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ cables.

c. No. 2 Buoy has been moved N. 50° W., a
distance of one mile.

d. No. 3 Buoy and No. 4 Buoy have each been
moved N.W., distances of 8 and 5 cables respec-
tively from the positions in which they were
previously moored.

e. No. 8 Buoy has been moved W.N.W., a
distance of $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles.

NOTE.—The track recommended on the Admi-
ralty Chart No. 1331 has been altered to pass
close northward of the new positions of the light-
vessel and Nos. 1 and 2 Buoys. No. 7 Buoy
should now be left on the starboard hand, entering
from seaward, Eastern Gate Post having extended
to the north-westward nearly up to that buoy.

Charts Nos. 1331 and 1329 will shortly be
cancelled.

(2.) *San Blas—Beacons Erected near Entrance.*

Also, information has been received from
Commander A. C. Woods, Her Majesty's ship
"Acorn," dated 4th December, 1896, that the
undermentioned beacons have been erected near
the entrance to San Blas Harbour:—

a. Rubia Head Beacon, situated about N. 12°
W., distant half a mile from Rubia Head Hill
(37), is a pyramidal structure, surmounted by a
ball, the whole painted white.

Approximate position, lat. 40° 35' 30" S., long.
62° 9' 45" W.

b. North-east Bank Beacon, situated on the
south-west point of North-east Bank, on the
Observation Spot, or about N. 12° W., distant
 $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, from Rubia Head Hill (37), is a
pyramidal structure, surmounted by a diamond,
the whole painted black.

c. Dos Hermanos Beacon, situated on the
western hummock of Dos Hermanos, or about
N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant $4\frac{1}{10}$ miles from Rubia
Head Hill (37), is a post, surmounted by a cross
piece and a ball, the whole painted white.
