Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Nous, Ali-Pacha-Bey, Possesseur du Royaume de Tunis,

Avons pris le décret suivant :

ART. 1. Est interdite, jusqu'à nouvel ordre, l'importation en Tunisie des drilles, chiffons, linges de corps, hardes, vêtements portés et objets de literie, ayant servi (non transportés comme bagages), ainsi que des cuirs verts, peaux fraîches, débris frais d'animaux, onglons, sabots, venant de Bombay ou de toute autre localité des Indes où la peste aurait été constatée.

ART. 2. Est également interdit le transit à travers la Tunisie des objets désignés à l'article 1.

ART. 3. Notre Premier Ministre est chargé de l'exécution du présent décret.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Decree published by the Italian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz. :—

Decree.

ART. 1. Article 4 of the Ordinance of the 29th December, 1896,* will be applied only to ships coming from the ports of Hindustan, and to those of different provenience [sic] which have touched there excepting in those cases where the merchandise specified in Article 4 which has been embarked on these latter vessels in the ports of Hindustan has been stored in places specially set aside for it, and has been kept separate from that embarked in the preceding ports.

ART. 2. With regard to sending ships to the sanitary stations, when it is necessary, they will be obliged for the present to put in at Asinara, until some other station shall be designated, when occasion shall arise.

The Prefects of the maritime provinces, Port Captains, and other officials, are charged with the execution of the present Ordinance.

Le Président de la République française,

Sur le rapport des ministres de l'intérieur et des finances,

Vu la loi 3 Mars 1822 ;

Vu le décret du 19 Janvier 1897, portant interdiction d'importation ou de transit en France et en Algérie d'objets ou marchandises en provenance des ports indiens contaminés de peste ;

Vu l'article 1er du décret du 27 Janvier 1897, limitant le nombre des ports ouverts aux provenances des pays contaminés de peste ;

Vu la délibération du comité de direction des services de l'hygiène, en date du 6 Février 1897.

Décète :

ART. 1er.—Les dispositions du décret du 19 Janvier susvisé sont étendues dans les ports de la Méditerranée à toutes les marchandises provenant directement ou indirectement de Bombay, de Kuratchi et des autres ports contaminés de peste.

Dans les ports de l'Océan et de la Manche, les marchandises non prohibées par le décret susvisé ne seront admises qu'après désinfection.

ART. 2.—Les passagers provenant de ports reconnus contaminés de peste ne pourront entrer en France que par les ports de Pauillac, Saint-Nazaire, le Havre et Dunkerque.

Ils ne seront admis à débarquer qu'après qu'ils auront subi une observation fixée à huit jours pour Pauillac et Saint-Nazaire, à quatre jours pour le Havre et Dunkerque, et que leurs bagages auront été désinfectés.

ART. 3.—Est rapporté l'article 1er du décret du 27 Janvier 1897.

ART. 4.—Le ministre de l'intérieur et le ministre des finances sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera publié au Journal Officiel et inséré au Bulletin des lois.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Trieste, inclosing the following copy of a Quarantine Notice issued by the Austro-Hungarian Government, viz. :—

(Translation.) No. 1122.

Circular of the Imperial Royal Marine Board to all the Imperial Royal Offices and Officers and subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers.

By order of the High Imperial Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce, and of Finance dated January the 24th, 1897 (B.L.T. No. 29), in consequence of the spreading of the bubonic plague in the East Indies and other South Asiatic Territories as well as the continued existence of epidemic disease (cholera and small-pox) in many parts of Asia, and taking into consideration the advice of the Supreme Sanitary Council in agreement with the Royal Hungarian Government the prohibition is decreed of the importation and transit of the following goods and articles from Asia, Asiatic Russia excepted.

1st. Of rags and tatters.

2nd. Of unwashed old used body linen, of old clothing, including old stockings, also of old bed linen, counterpanes, &c., old carpets, covers, mattresses, pillows, and other old articles that are used as bed furniture.

From the above prohibition the following articles are exempted; except at the discretion of the Sanitary Police.

(a.) Rags compressed by hydraulic force, also carpets forwarded in the original packing as wholesale merchandise in closed bales, solidly secured, and marked with the marks of origin of well-known wholesale commercial firms.

(b.) Of new remnants which are introduced directly into the wholesale market from industrial establishments, such as spinning mills, texture factories, tailoring establishments, and bleaching factories. Shoddy and paper scraps are also exempted.

(c.) Of the objects mentioned under Section 2, if the same are contained in personal baggage belonging to persons arriving from the above mentioned countries.

But on crossing the frontier all the above have to undergo examination by the Sanitary Police, and the prescribed treatment of the Sanitary Police.

The transit of articles excluded from importation is only allowed against an official certificate proving that the importation is permitted into the neighbouring Foreign State which is the destination of the goods, and under the stipulation that their transport is effected under conditions of isolation in closed vehicles, so that manipulation during transit is prevented.

This Order comes into force on the day that it is received by the respective Custom House Offices, and of the Marine Sanitary Offices.

SHORE OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT WHITEHEAD, CO. ANTRIM.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1852, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Belfast, to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or banks of the sea at Whitehead, between a point opposite the boundary between the townlands of Castle-town and Whitehead, and a point opposite the point or promontory known as Whitehead, being within the said port:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or banks of the sea at Whitehead, between the points above-mentioned.
