

In the High Court of Justice.—Companies
(Winding-up).

Mr. Justice Vaughan Williams.
No. 0034 of 1897.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts 1862 to 1890 and in the Matter of the South Lupaardsvlei Gold Mines Limited.
