IT is hereby notified that the Belgian Government have modified the Form of Declaration to be issued by the Belgian Legation in London in cases of Mixed Marriages in the United Kingdombetween British and Belgian subjects, so as to bring it into accord with the Law of April 30, 1896, amending the Marriage Law of Belgium.

The following is a copy of the Modified Form of Declaration:

Form of Declaration to be issued by the Belgian Minister in cases of Marriage in the United Kingdom between British and Belgian Subjects. Le Ministre de Belgique à déclare—

I. Que les Belges ne peuvent se marier sans avoir obtenu le consentement de leurs parents, cu des autres personnes indiquées par la loi. H. Que d'après les pièces que lui ont été présentées, M (nom, prénom, et profession), né à le demeurant à et qui propose de contracter mariage avec M (nom, prénom, et profession), né à le , demeurant à , est de nationalité Belge.

III. Que les preservitions de la contracter de

III. Que les prescriptions de la loi Belge du 26 Décembre 1891 ont été observées en ce qui concerne la publication de son futur mariage.

IV. Que le futur éponx a produit les pièces (indiquer cès pièces) qui établissent, soit qu'il a obtenu pour son mariage le consentement des parents ou d'autres personnes dont le consentement est exigé, soit qui les parents dont le consentement eût été nécessaire sont décédés, soit que les formalités nécessaires pour suppléer à ce consentement ont été remplies (le Ministre pourrait indiquer ici de quelles personnes le consentement émane). 4. Que le mariage projeté ne viole pas les défenses de mariage entre parents et alliés au degré prohibé (Articles 161 à 163 du Code Civil), ou que les dispenses prévues par la loi aient été obtenues (Code Civil, Article 164; Loi du 28 Février, 1831).

Le Ministre déclare encore que l'étrangère qui épouse un Belge devient Belge par le fait seul de son mariage (Article 12 du Code Civil), et que les enfants issus du mariage, même nés en pays étranger, sont Belges (Article 10 et 312 du Code Civil).

The Belgian Minister in declares -

I. That Belgian subjects cannot contract marriage without having obtained the consent of their parents, or of other persons, as prescribed by law.

II. That according to the papers presented to him, M. (insert surname, Christian name, and calling), born at on the , residing at , and who proposes to contract marriage with M. (insert surname, Christian name, and calling), born at on the , residing at , is of Belgian nationality.

III. That, in accordance with the provisions of Belgian law, notice of his (her) intended marriage has been duly published.

IV. That the intended husband has produced

the papers (here note them) which establish either that he has obtained for his marriage the consent of the parents or other persons whose consent is required, or that the parents whose consent would have been necessary are deceased, or that the formalities necessary to supply the place of that consent have been fulfilled. (The Minister may note here from what persons the consent emanates.) Articles 1, 2, 3,4, 5, 6, and 7 of the Belgian Law of April 30, 1896; Articles 154, 158, and 159 of the Civil Code.

V. That no opposition to this marriage has been raised up to this date, and that, if none be offered up to the moment of the celebration of the marriage, the parties would be competent to

contract marriage in Belgium.

The Minister declares, moreover, that marriage contracted in a foreign country between a Belgian subject and a foreigner is valid if it has been celebrated in accordance with the laws of the country, and provided:—

1. That the parties to the intended marriage be of the age required by law, i.e., 18 years for the bridegroom and 15 years for the bride (Article 144 of the Civil Code), or that they have obtained a dispensation of age (Royal Decree of the 5th January, 1854).

2. That the consent of each of the parties has been absolutely free (Article 146 of the

Civil Code).

3. That neither of the parties be bound by a previous marriage (Article 147 of the Civil Code).

4. That the intended marriage do not violate the prohibitions of marriage between relations within the forbidden degrees (Articles 161 to 163 of the Civil Code), or that the dispensations required by law have been obtained (Article 164 of the Civil Code; Law of the 28th February, 1831).

The Minister also declares that a foreign woman marrying a Belgian becomes Belgian through the sole fact of her marriage (Article 12 of the Civil Code), and that the children, issue of the marriage, even when born in a foreign country, are Belgian (Articles 10 and 312 of the Civil Code).

(Translation.)

Decree relative to the restriction of imports

from Asia of February 8, 1897.

WE William, by the Grace of God German Emperor, King of Prussia, &c., decree in the name of the Empire, and with the consent of the Federal Council, as follows:—

§ 1. In order to prevent the introduction of the plague, the importation by sea of the articles enumerated below from Persia, the continent of India, Formosa, Hong Kong, Macao and China south of the 30th degree of latitude is prohibited until further notice:

Personal linen, old and worn articles of clothing, used bedding, rags of all kinds, carpets, numan hair, untanned skins and hides, unmanufactured hair and bristles, wool, claws and hoofs.

- § 2. The prohibition in § 1 does not apply to personal linen, clothes, bedding and carpets which travellers carry with them for their personal use or which are imported as personal effects (Umgugsgut). The permission to import such articles may, however, be made conditional upon their previous disinfection.
- § 3. The Chancellor of the Empire is empowered to allow exceptions to be made to the above prohibition, under suitable precautionary measures.

4. This Decree comes into force on the day of its promulgation.

of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Antwerp, enclosing the following Regulations respecting Quarantine, viz.:—

(Translation.)

Precautions to be taken at the Sanitary Station at Doel in the cases of all vessels (including those having clean bills of health) coming from infected ports, whether they have touched at intermediate ports or not.

Indirect Arrivals.

- 1. Disinfection of all latrines and urinals, and such other parts of the ship as may be deemed necessary.
- 2. The bilge water shall be pumped out, and a fresh supply of drinking water taken on board.

3. The Sanitary Officials shall inspect the list of passengers and the crew list and examine every person on heard.

every person on board.

If it shall be found that any of the persons who left the port of origin with the vessel are no longer on board, satisfactory proof shall be demanded that they did not leave the ship on account of any epidemic or contagious disease.

4. The ship's manifest shall be submitted to the Sanitary Inspector, in order that he may ascertain that there are no goods on board of a suspicious nature or of which the introduction is forbidden.

In order to facilitate the carrying out of these measures, vessels can, if necessary, be detained at

the Sanitary Station during one tide.

Any vessels having on board no merchandise of a suspicious or prohibited nature, can be exempted from detention, if a duly signed copy of her manifest has, five days before arrival, been forwarded to the President of the Sanitary Commission, and if they are able to produce a certificate (in duplicate) of the Sanitary Authorities of a port of call, free of any contagious disease, stating:-

a. That measures for disinfection, similar to those described in provisions 1 and 2, have been

carried into effect.

(b.) That no person on board has suffered from any contagious disease during the whole voyage, if the duration thereof shall have been at least twelve days between the last infected port visited and the port at which the certificate is granted.

If the above conditions shall have been fulfilled the Master must slacken speed at Doel to permit the quarantine boat to come alongside. duplicate bills of health shall be delivered to the Sanitary Inspector; one of these shall be retained by him, and the other, after having been dated and stamped, will be returned to the Master, who shall deliver it to the Customs Authorities on his arrival in the port.

The greater number of countries having taken effective quarantine measures with regard to all goods coming from the plague-stricken districts of India, vessels arriving at Antwerp from healthy ports need undergo no special sanitary formalities.

At the same time certificates of origin must be produced for any suspicious or prohibited goods arriving even from a healthy port.

Merchandise.

A. Merchandise of which the introduction is forbidden even in transit.

hoofs, &c., fresh animal matter, &c. (Exception is made in the case of salted green hides which have been treated with arsenic, which are admitted for sale in Belgium.)

- 5. Bottles of liqueur and perfumes, imported

7. Samples of raw wool, cotton, and jute, if not

compressed and bound with hoops. The goods mentioned in Nos. 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 can be admitted after having been disinfected by

the apparatus at the Doel Sanitary Station. B. Merchandise admitted in transit but not for

sale in Belgium.

1. Raw wool in pressed bales bound with hoops.

2. All dress goods and drill stuffs packed in pressed bales and bound with hoops.

The Sanitary Authorities can, however, order the bales to be sprinkled with disinfectant before they are unloaded from the vessel.

Justice and Police Department of the Norwegian Government.

Christiania, February 5, 1897. Under date of the 1st instant, the following Royal Proclamation has been drawn up:-

" With reference to § 2 of the Quarantine Law of the 12th July, 1848, notice is hereby given, that ports in Arabia, Persia, and British India ('Forindien'), together with Formosa, and the Pescadores in Eastern Asia, shall, until further notice, be regarded as infected with the Oriental pest; and that in compliance therewith, the regulations concerning quarantine against the pest contained in the above-named law, are to be immediately enforced, to which all persons concerned are required obediently to conform.'

This is hereby made known in order to draw attention to the fact that at present unloading quarantine can only be performed at Christiansand Quarantine Station—See § 8 in the Quarantine Law of the 12th July, 1848, and § 11 in the Quarantine Regulation of the 10th February,

b. The starboard side of the channel is marked by buoys or perches, painted red, and surmounted by one or two brooms.

c. The port side of the channel is marked by buoys or perches, painted white, and surmounted

by one or two straw wisps.

d. Middle grounds and dangers that may be passed on either side are marked by buoys or perches, painted red and white in stripes, and surmounted by a broom over a straw wisp.

e. Distinguishing marks are painted red and white in stripes, and surmounted by a red and

white striped ball.

3. a. APPLICATION OF SYSTEM.—The starboard side of a fairway is that which is on the starboard side of a vessel when entering; and the

port side that which is on the port side.

b. In the Skagerrak, the Kattegat, the Sound, the Great Belt, and the Little Belt, a vessel is said to be entering the channel when proceeding from the North Sea towards a Danish harbour or to the Baltic.

c. In land-locked fiords and inlets to a port or roadstead, a vessel is said to be entering when

d. Liim fiord, Smaalands Fairway, and the fairway southward of Fyen are considered as each two land-locked fiords; the meeting points, respectively, being Logstör, Masnedo, and Svendborg-Marstal.

5. WRECKS.—A wreck-marking vessel buoy is painted green and carries as a topmark
