OFFICIAL VOCABULARY FOR CODE TELEGRAMS.

A NOTICE under the above heading appeared in the London Gazette of the 12th January, 1894.

The decision embodied in that notice under which the use of the Official Vocabulary would have become compulsory for European code telegrams from the 1st January, 1898, was not maintained by the International Telegraph Conference recently held at Budapest.

Under the decision of the Budapest Conference the Vocabulary is to be enlarged, and the use of the new Vocabulary is to become obligatory both for European and extra-European telegrams, but not until a date to be fixed by a future Conference. The next Conference will not be held before 1901.

All words in the present edition of the Vocabulary, with the exception of a few incorrect expressions, a list of which has been distributed to all purchasers, will be included in the new edition which is now in preparation by the International Bureau of Telegraph Administrations at Berne, and the Bureau has announced, in a circular of which a translation is appended, that all legitimate words in existing codes will also be inserted, if such codes or a list of the words comprised in such codes be forwarded to the Bureau before the 31st of March next.

Persons who now make use of any legitimate code-words other than those contained in the present edition of the Official Vocabulary are, therefore, recommended, if they desire to ensure the continued validity of such words, to forward copies of their codes or collection of code-words to the International Bureau as requested.

As there appears to be a certain amount of misapprehension on some points arising out of the request that codes or collections of code-words may be submitted to the Bureau, the Postmaster-General thinks it right to call attention to the following points:-

 It is unnecessary to send to the Bureau copies of codes which have been compiled from the present edition of the Official Vocabulary, as all the words in that work, with the exception of a few incorrect expressions, will be incorporated in the new edition.

2. It is unnecessary to send to the Bureau individual copies of published codes or of codes compiled from published collections of code-words. if the compilers or proprietors of those published codes or collections of code-words have themselves forwarded the works in question to the Bureau.

3. The Bureau is not concerned to know the meanings attached to code-words, and it is quite sufficient for the purpose in view if a list of the words comprised in each code be forwarded.

4. The Postmaster-General will, if desired, communicate with proprietors or publishers of codes, in order to ascertain whether they have taken step to ensure the continued validity of legitimate words in their codes by complying with the request of the Bureau.

5. The Postmaster-General will, if desired, forward to the Bureau codes or collections of code-words sent to him with that object.

(Translation.)

CIRCULAR to Chambers of Commerce, Codemakers, &c., on the subject of the Second Edition of the Official Vocabulary.

The International Telegraph Conference which met at Budapest from June 16 to July 22, 1896, has given to Regulation VIII, which treats of code language and of the Official Vocabulary, the following form:—

REGULATION VIII.

"1. Code language is that which is composed of words each having an intrinsic meaning, but not forming intelligible phrases, in one or more of the languages authorized for telegraphic correspondence in plain language.

"2. Words used in code language must not exceed in length ten letters according to the Morse alphabet. They must be taken from one or more of the following languages:—English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Dutch, Portuguese, and

Latin.

"3. Proper names cannot be used in telegrams drawn up wholly or partly in code language except in so far as they are used in their natural meaning. Those proper names, however, which appear in the Official Vocabulary, can be accepted with a code meaning.

"4. The office of origin may demand of the sender the production of his code, in order to ascertain whether the rules laid down in the three preceding paragraphs are duly complied with.

"5. From a date to be fixed by a future Conference, all words used in private telegrams drawn up in code language shall be taken from the Official Vocabulary prepared by the International Bureau of Telegraphic Administrations, duly enlarged."

It follows from this regulation that the International Bureau of Telegraph Administrations is instructed to prepare and publish a new edition, duly enlarged, of the Official Vocabulary.

In the discussion of the subject which preceded the decisions of the Conference, the general opinion as to the character of this second edition of the Official Vocabulary was clearly indicated. The essential points which were settled are as follows:—

The second edition must contain many more words than the first, in order to meet all the requirements of commerce. It must in every respect bear the character of a vocabulary pure and simple, i.e., a dictionary of the words in the eight authorized languages, from which code compilers may select such as they find most suitable. Thus, it is essential to avoid any selection of words or any special arrangement which might lead the purchaser of this second edition to confound it with a code. Further, it will no longer be necessary to pay attention to typographic, telegraphic, or phonetic similarity between words. There will, consequently, be found in the Vecabulary words differing from each other by only one letter, and between which the telegraphic dissimilarity may be reduced to nil.

It is to be anticipated that sooner or later this new Vocabulary will be declared obligatory for both the European and the extra-European tele-

graph services.

With the view of affecting as little as possible possessors of private codes already existing, the International Bureau considers it desirable to insert in this new edition, as far as circumstances permit, all the words in these codes, provided that they are legitimate words, not mutilated, and are taken from the eight authorized languages, and provided that they do not contain less than five nor more than ten letters.

To attain this object, it will be necessary that

the International Bureau should be in possession of codes the validity of which the compiler or possessor wishes to assure after the final adoption of the Official Vocabulary.

The International Bureau, therefore, begs Chambers of Commerce, publishers of codes, and any persons who desire that the words of particular codes should be found in the Second Edition of the Official Vocabulary, to forward, before the end of the present year,* one copy of such codes to the address given below.

It must be understood that the codes are to be sent free of cost, and that the words appearing therein may be used without giving rise to proceedings for infringement of copyright.
