Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following circular, issued by the Imperial Royal Marine Board, viz.:—

(Translation.) No. 2080.

Circular of the Imperial Royal Marine Board to all the Imperial Royal Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers:—

By instructions of February the 18th of the current year by the High Imperial Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and of Finance (B.L.I. No. 54) in addition to the instructions of January the 24th of the current year (B.L.I. No. 29) in consequence of the existence of the bubonic plague in different South Asiatic territories, and taking into consideration the advice of the Supreme Sanitary Council in agreement with the Royal Hungarian Government, the prohibition is decreed of the importation and transit of raw animal substances such as uncalcined hides, unprepared and green; also the importation of bones, horns, hoofs, bladders, and intestines; if the above are sent separate from the carcase, also the importation of animal hair and hogs' bristles from British Indian ports; also from ports on the west coasts as far as the Red Sea.

This Order comes into force on the day that it is received by the respective Custom House Officers and of the Marine Sanitary Offices.

This is issued in addition to the Government Circular of January the 27th, 1897, No. 1122, for information and guidance.

at Vienna, enclosing the following notice respecting quarantine, viz.:—

Order of the Ministry for the Interior for Commerce and Finance, dated February 18th, 1897, respecting import and transit of certain animal products and waste from the ports of British India, and from those situated between British India and the Red Sea.

With reference to the Order of the 24th January, 1897 (R. G. Bl. No. 29), and in consideration of the professional opinion of the Head Sanitary Authority on the subject of the existence of bubonic plague in some of the districts of Southern Asia, with which the Royal Hungarian Government agree, the importation of and transit traffic in fresh animal products such as raw, unprepared, untanned skins and hides, bones, horns, hoofs, trotters, bladders, and intestines, in as far as the above articles consist of animal waste, also hair and brushes is hereby forbidden when the above-named products come from the ports of British India or from those situated between British India and the Red Sea.

This Order comes into force on the day on which it is brought to the notice of the Custom Houses and Marine Sanitary Offices which it concerns.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Berlin. enclosing the following communication respecting quarantine, viz.:—

(Translation.)

Berlin, February 25, 1897.

The undersigned has the honour to transmit to Sir Frank Lascelles, in reply to His Excellency's note of the 22nd instant, the accompanying copy of a note addressed by the Imperial Chancellor on the 13th instant to the Governments of the Confederated States, based on paragraph 3 of the Imperial Decree of the 8th instant, respecting restrictions on importations from Asia.

By this note the Imperial Chancellor approves the unimpeded admission into the territory of the Empire of all products derived from India, where it can be proved that they left the port of embarkation before the 12th instant. Those goods which come from the plague-stricken ports of Bombay and Karachi, or which give rise to suspicion on other grounds, are excepted from this favourable treatment. As regards the exceptional admission of products of this description, the Imperial Chancellor has reserved to himself the right of deciding on each individual case.

No Regulations have been issued by the Imperial Government respecting the mode in which the process of proving that the goods in question left the port of embarkation before the 12th instant, should be conducted.

Nothing is as yet known here regarding the special provisions which have been enacted by the Governments of the Confederated States, on the basis of the accompanying note. The necessary information was however requested on the occasion of the enquiry addressed by His Excellency the Ambassador.

Berlin, February 13, 1897.

The measure prohibiting importation, as a protection from the danger of plague, which was enacted by means of an Imperial Decree of the 8th instant, came into force on the day of its publication, and is therefore applicable to all consignments of goods which arrived subsequent to that dute, i.e., to the 9th instant. It appears, however, desirable on grounds of justice, to permit the importation of all goods shipped to Germany before the prohibitive measure came to be universally known, so far as sanitary considerations allow. On the basis, therefore, of paragraph 3 of the Decree above-mentioned, I hereby approve the unimpeded admission on exceptional grounds into the territory of the Empire of all products of the nature specified in paragraph 1 of the said Decree, where it can be proved that they left the port of embarkation before the 12th instant.

Such goods as are derived from the plague-stricken ports of Bombay, Karachi, Hongkong, Canton, Swatau, Amoy, Macao, and the Island of Formosa, or which give cause for suspicion in other respects, are exempted from this favourable treatment. As regards the exceptional admission of goods of the latter description, I reserve to myself the right to decide in each individual case. In such cases, the question whether a thoroughly effective process of disinfection has previously taken place will be the chief point to be considered. I respectfully request that in cases of this kind the applications addressed to me for permission to allow the importation may be accompanied by a statement of opinion as to the measures of precaution held to be necessary in each separate instance.

Objet : Mesures Sanitaires. Anvers, le 25 Février 1897.

Monsieur.

J'ai l'honneur de porter à votre connaissance que par arrêté ministériel en date du 23 de ce mois, la Perse et la partie de l'empire Chinois située au sud du 30e degré de latitude, ont été déclarés contaminés par la peste bubonique.

En conséquence, les provenances de ces régions seront soumises aux mêmes mesures que celles appliquées aux navires venant de l'Inde.

La commission sanitaire de l'Escaut, dans sa dernière séance, a aussi apporté quelques modifications à la liste des marchandises prohibées ; en outre, il a paru utile pour vous faciliter l'accomplissement de mesures imposées, de préciser davantage les conditions dans lesquelles les navires pourront être dispensés de l'arrêt à la station sanitaire de Doel.

Vour trouverez les indications ci-incluses, ainsi que la nomenclature complète des marchandises dont l'entrée est interdite, soit en consommation soit en trausit.

La présente communication annule celles faites par mes lettres des 6 et 17 de ce mois.

Mesures auxquelles sont soumis à la station sanitaire de Doel, tous les navires, même indemnes, venant d'une région contaminée, avec ou sans

1°. Désinfection des latrines et lieux d'aisance et de toutes les parties suspectes du navire.

2°. Evacuation des eaux de câle et renouvelle-

ment de la provision d'eau potable.

3°. Inspection de la liste des passagers et du rôle d'équipage et visite de toutes les personnes se trouvant à bord.

S'il est constaté que toutes les personnes qui ont quitté le port d'origine, ne se trouvent plus à bord du navire, il devra être justifié qu'aucune d'elles n'a été débarquée à la suite d'une atteinte de maladie contagieuse ou épidémique.

4°. Remise du manifeste à l'agent sanitaire, pour qu'il puisse s'assurer qu'il n'y a pas à bord

des marchandises suspectes ou prohibées. En vue de faciliter l'exécution de ces mesures,

les navires pourront être retenus à la station

sanitaire pendant une marée.

Pourront être dispensés de tout arrêt, les navires n'ayant pas à bord des marchandises suspectes ou prohibées, et dont une copie, dûment signée, du manifeste (1) aura été remise par les destinataires au Président de la commission sanitaire (2), au moins cinq jours avant leur arrivée, s'ils peuvent en outre produire un certificat en double de l'autorité sanitaire d'un port d'escale, indemne de toute maladie contagieuse, constatant:

(a) que des mesures de désinfection analogues à celles prescrites sub. nis 1 et 2, y ont été appliquées ;

(b) que le personnel a été indemne pendant tout le voyage, si la durée de celui-ci a été au moins de 12 jours entre le dernier port contaminé et celui où le certificat a été délivré.

Dans ce cas, le capitaine ralentira la marche du navire pour permettre l'accostage facile de la

chaloupe de la quarantaine.

L'un des doubles du certificat sera remis à l'agent sanitaire et l'autre sera daté et visé par lui et remis par le capitaine à l'administration de la douane à l'arrivée du navire dans le port.

Provenances Indirectes.

et cerclés.

Les marchandises reprises sub nis 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 et 8, peuvent entrer librement après avoir été désinfectées par l'étuve à la station sanitaire de

B.—Marchandises admises en transit mais non en consommation:

1º Cuirs verts, salés ou saumurés, peaux fraîches et tous cuirs non tannés, emballés de manière à permettre leur manipulation sans que les ouvriers viennent en contact direct avec la marchandise.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

RULE OF THE SUPREME COURT.

THE following Draft Rule is published pursuant to the above mentioned Act :-

Order XXX.

Rule 1 of Order XXX of the Rules of the Supreme Court, November 1893, is hereby annulled, and the following Rule shall be substituted in lieu thereof -

1.—(a.) Subject as hereinafter mentioned, in every action a summons for directions shall be taken out by the plaintiff returnable in not less than four days.

(b.) Such summons shall be taken out after appearance and before the plaintiff takes any fresh step in the action other than application for an injunction, or for a receiver, or for summary judgment under Order XIV.

(c.) The summons shall be in the Form No. 3 (a) Appendix K, with such variations as circumstances may require, and shall be addressed to and served upon all such parties to the action as may be affected thereby.

(d.) This Rule shall not apply to Admiralty actions within the meaning of section thirty-four of the Judicature Act, 1873, or to actions coming

under the provisions of Order XVIIIA.

(e.) Where under Order XVIIIA the defendant applies for a statement of claim, the Judge may deal with such application as if the plaintiff had been entitled to take out and had taken out a summons for directions.

FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST.

IN pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 5th day of March, 1897, has been made on his representa-tion by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, ordering, directing, and declaring that on and from the 15th day of March, 1897, the registration fee imposed by clause 6, sub-clause (1), paragraph (b) of the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Compensation Warrant, 1894, in relation to the compulsory registration of a parcel, shall be four pence instead of eight pence.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Out-door Labour Test:—

Farringdon Union. To the Guardians of the Poor of the Farringdon Union :-

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and Townships comprised in the said Union;-

And to all others whom it may concern. WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Farringdon Union, as follows :-

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say,-

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles

of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2 .- The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall

ARTICLE 3 .- If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board. and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of such an officer.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 11TH MARCH 1897.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The islands, three in number, are surrounded by coral reefs; the southern island being named according to Carteret, Pegun; and the two northern, Onello and Onatu. The native name for the group is Mapia.

2. Stephens Islands, marked on Admiralty Chart No. 942b as situated in lat. 0° 2' S., long. 137° 55' E., were originally reported by Captain Carteret, His Majesty's ship "Swallow," in 1767, and were sighted by him the day before he saw the Freewill Islands. There is no record of the Stephens Islands having been sighted by anyone since they were originally reported.

As Captain Carteret's position of the Freewill Islands was 3° of longitude eastward of the present accepted position, it seems clear that Stephens Islands cannot at any rate be in the

position assigned.

The position of the "Swallow" on the day the Stephens Islands were discovered, calculated back from the present accepted position of the Freewill Islands, was 0° 5' north latitude, and about 136° 5' east longtitude, and from this position the islands bore S. 2° W. (true) and S. 4° E. (true).

It is therefore not impossible that Carteret may have mistaken the high peaks of the Schouten Islands (1,600 feet high) for two islands.

Report to the Barry Urban District Council, pursuant to section 7 of the above-mentioned Act.
