THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Petropolis, enclosing the following translation of a Decree respecting Quarantine published by the Brazilian Government, viz. :—

Extract from Journal Official of 2nd February, 1897.

ART. 5. For the execution of the sanitary work of the ports, the shore of the Republic shall be divided into three sanitary districts each with its own Lazaretto, governed by district directors.

These sanitary districts shall consist : the first, of the Port of Rio de Janeiro with the Lazaretto of Ilha Grande, the second, of the Port of Recife, with the Lazaretto of Tamandaré, the third, of the Port of Belim with the Lazaretto of Pará.

The sanitary directors of the second and third districts shall be subordinate to the Director-General who shall administer the work of the first district.

ART. 6. The states are permitted to establish in their ports sanitary stations for the disinfection of ships which by destination or necessity may have to enter and take or discharge cargo, such stations being subject as regards the regular quarantine administration to the superintendence of the Federal authority of the port.

By authorization of the Government on the proposal of the state Government after hearing the General Directorate of Public Health, the sanitary stations may be raised to the category of Lazarettos without further burden on the Federal Treasury except by determination of the Legislative Power. In this latter case, on the said transformation being decided by Congress the port where the station shall be established, shall be the centre of a new district.

ART. 7. The requisite quarantines shall only be effectual in Federal Lazarettos, except only in the case of the national territory being invaded by epidemics of exotic origin and having regard to the convenience, recognized by the Federal Government, of the reciprocal protection of the States.

ART. 1er.—Est interdite jusqu'à nouvel ordre l'importation en France et en Algérie des drilles, des chiffons, des laines, sauf les tapis, des linges de corps ayant servi ou n'ayant pas servi, des hardes ou vêtements ayant servi ou n'ayant pas servi, des objets de literie ayant servi ou n'ayant pas servi, des cuirs verts, des peaux fraîches, des débris frais d'animaux, des onglons, des sabots, venant directement ou indirectement de toute localité où la peste aura été constatée.

ART. 2. Est également interdit le transit à travers la France ou l'Algérie des objets désignés à l'article 1er, toutes les fois que ce transit donne lieu à un débarquement ou à une manipulation quelconque.

ART. 3. Sont exceptés de la prohibition prescrite par l'article 1er le linge de corps, les vêtements, les objets de literie, transportés par les voyageurs pour leur usage personnel. Ces objets ne seront introduits qu'après désinfection.

ART 4. Les tapis vieux ou neufs ne pourront entrer en France ou en Algérie qu'après désinfection.

ART. 5. A partir de la promulgation du présent décret, aucun navire provenant d'une localité reconnue contaminée de peste, ou portant des tapis provenant directement ou indirectement d'une localité reconnue contaminée de peste, ne pourra pénétrer en France ou en Algérie que par un des ports suivants : Marseille, Alger, Pauillac, Saint-Nazaire, le Havre et Dunkerque.

ART. 6. Tout colis contenant quelqu'un des objets visés aux articles 1 et 4 du présent décret et provenant d'un des ports de l'Océan Indien autre que ceux reconnus contaminés de peste, depuis Mascate, y compris les ports du golfe Persique, jusqu'au cap Comorin, doit être accompagné d'un certificat d'origine visé par un agent consulaire français.

ART. 7. Sont rapportés les décrets du 19 Janvier, du 27 Janvier et du 9 Février 1897.

ART. 8. Le ministre de l'intérieur et le ministre des finances sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera publié au Journal officiel et inséré au Bulletin des lois.

PORTLAND HARBOUR.

Discontinuance of Lights and Fog Signals at Certain Dolphins.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 633 of 1896:—

Further notice is given that the breakwaters on the northern side of Portland Harbour are now in course of construction on the line of the dolphins already existing, and Mariners are again warned that only the channel between dolphins B and C (about 9 cables N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from the northern extremity of the Outer Breakwater) and the channel between dolphin A (the south-eastern one) and the north end of the Outer Breakwater, can be used with safety for entering Portland Harbour on the north side.

Also, that, on 1st March, 1897, the lights shown from, and the fog signals given at, the dolphins, and also the lights from the end of the groyne, were discontinued, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

1. Dolphins A, B, and C, each show two white balls placed vertically, by day; and two white lights, placed vertically, by night, as before.

2. The only fog signal (in addition to that at the Breakwater Lighthouse) is a bell, at dolphin B, on the south side of the northern channel.

No. 144.—YANG TSE KIANG ENTRANCE.
Alterations in Depths and Buoyage of South and North Channels.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 733 of 1896:—

The Chinese Government has given notice, dated 28th December, 1896, that a survey of the South Channel, entrance to the Yang tse Kiang, has recently been made, from near Tung Sha Light-vessel to abreast Small Island, near the entrance to Wusung River:—

The best channel is now north-eastward of the Kiu Toan Light-vessel, and not south-westward as formerly.

Directions for South Channel.—Vessels entering the Yang tse should pass about 2 cables south-westward of Tung Sha Light-vessel, and then keep that light-vessel bearing S. 49° E. astern, until Kiu Toan Light-vessel is sighted bearing N. 49° W., when the latter light-vessel should be kept on that bearing ahead, until it is about 3 miles distant, or the beacon on House Island bears N.E. Then steer to pass about one to $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables north-eastward of Kiu Toan Light-vessel, and after passing bring it to bear S. 61° E. astern, within a distance of one mile from it, keeping that light-vessel bearing S. 61° E. until it is 6 miles distant, or Kiu Toan small beacon bears about W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. A vessel will then be a little north-eastward of mid-channel and Admiralty Chart, No. 1602 may be used as a guide to Wusung Outer Bar.

On the above track, the least depths were 21 feet, about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north-westward of Tung Sha Light-vessel, thence 22 to 28 feet to abreast of House Island Beacon, decreasing to 18 feet past Kiu Toan Light-vessel, where a bar with that depth and about 2 miles in width has been formed by the junction of the Middle Ground and Blockhouse Shoal. After passing this bar, the water gradually deepens to 5 fathoms at 4 miles west-north-westward of Kiu Toan Light-vessel.

Caution.—The Kiu Toan Light-vessel has sustained numerous collisions through vessels, mostly steamers, trying to cross her bows without making due allowance for the strength of the tide; and the crew of the light-vessel state that their lives are frequently imperilled by steam-vessels passing dangerously near, when there is no reason why they should not keep at a safe distance.

Vessels should not pass between Tung Sha Light-vessel and South-east Spit; the locality has not yet been re-surveyed, but a shoal patch has been found there, with a depth of only 6 feet on it at low water, where the charts show $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.

Buoys.—The buoy marking the north-west end of Middle Ground will shortly be withdrawn, and a new conical buoy, painted red, surmounted by a black inverted frustum cage, and named Blockhouse Shoal Buoy, will be moored on the edge of that shoal between Kiu Toan Light-vessel and South-east Knoll Buoy, in approximately lat. $31^{\circ} 18\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $121^{\circ} 45'$ E.

Also, the Chinese Government has given notice, dated 11th January, 1897, that systematic sweeping operations have been carried on in the north or Shaweishan Channel for a period of four months; this entrance is now considered free from all artificial obstructions, and the under-

mentioned alterations have been made in the buoyage marking the channel:—

1. Drinkwater Point Fairway Buoy (conical, red and black in horizontal stripes, surmounted by a black spherical cage) is moored with Shaweishan Lighthouse bearing N. 86° E., distant 12½ miles.

Approximate position, lat. 31° 24' 0" N., long. 121° 59' 50" E.

2. Chi Yao Buoy (conical, red, &c.) has been moved more than a mile S.E. by E. ½ E., and is now moored with Drinkwater Point surveying beacon bearing north, distant 2½ miles, or approximately in lat. 31° 25' 30" N., long. 121° 49' 0".

3. Middle Island Buoy is a new conical buoy, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, and surmounted by a black inverted frustum cage, moored in a position with Middle Island surveying beacon bearing S. 34° W., distant four miles; or approximately in lat. 31° 29' 20" N., long. 121° 39' 15" E.

4. Tsung Ming Bank Buoy (conical, red, &c.) has been moved about three miles E. by N., and is now moored with Middle Island surveying beacon bearing S. 5° E., distant three miles, or approximately in lat. 31° 28' 45" N., long. 121° 36' 20" E.

5. The black buoy, formerly moored in lat. 31° 28' 30" N., long. 121° 39' 40" E., has been withdrawn.

Directions for North Channel.—Vessels entering from seaward may steer from buoy to buoy, leaving those painted red and black in stripes on the port hand, and those painted red on the starboard hand. The channel appears to be most liable to change between Tsung Ming Bank and Bush and Middle Islands, where, for a length of five miles, it varies in width from half to three-quarters of a mile between the 18 feet contours.

Caution.—These changes render the present Admiralty Charts very unreliable as guides for the channels.
