Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, enclosing the following translation of a notice issued by the Spanish Government, viz.:-

Royal Order.

By the advice of the Council of Health, for the better application of the Royal Order of the 19th of this month published in the Gazette of the 20th, in view of the explanations asked for by certain Coast Sanitary Directors.

The King, &c., &c., orders as follows:
The provisions contained in the said Royal Orders shall be carried out in compliance with the terms of the Royal Order of September 23rd 1892:

The districts open to suspicion by reason of their proximity to, or their relations with, the infected spot, or those which do not take proper precautions, are for the effects of the said Royal Orders, those on the shores of the Red Sea, the Persian Gulf, the Gulf of Oman or Arabian Sea, he Gulf of Bengal, the China Sea, the Sea of Japan, and the Ports of India not declared foul, and arrivals from these places shall be subject to quarantine observation.

The arricles enumerated in the last of the said Royal Orders shall not be admitted if their place of origin is an infected district. The question of their point of origin to be decided by referring to the certificates of origin issued by the Consuls, unless the ships carrying the articles in question perform full quarantine in Lazaretto as provided for by the Sanitary Law.

Arrivals from other countries shall be admitted to free pratique if they arrive in favourable conditions as prescribed by the Sanitary Law and Royal Orders of March 31st 1888 and September 23rd 1892.

Similarly the articles in question shall be rejected at the French, Portuguese, and Linea frontiers if coming from infected districts, and those unaccompanied by their certificates of origin will be subjected to rigorous disinfection.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following copy of a notice issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :-

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 1 of 2nd January, 1897, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:-

1. Any shipment of cattle, any part of which is found to be suffering, or to be suspected of suffering, from an infectious or contagious disease at the time of arrival or after a period of inspection, is to be detained in quarantine.

2. Should the existence of cattle plague be verified before landing, the cargo will not be allowed to land.

3. The importation of cattle of any kind from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria, Sicily, Syria (including Alexandretta), and Salonica, is prohibited, and the introduction into these Islands of wool, hides, skins, horns, bones and hoofs from the above places and from countries where epidemic diseases are prevailing is likewise prohibited.

- 4. Cattle intended for importation into these Islands must be accompanied by a certificate stating the place of their origin and the fact that cattle disease has not prevailed in that place (with as far as can be ascertained the route followed from any inland station to the port of embarkation) during the three months previous to the date of embarkation. Such certificate shall be given by the British Consular Authority at the places of origin and embarkation, or if there be no such British Consular Authority, by the local Government authority of the places of origin and embarkation.
- 5. Vessels arriving in this Island, having on board more than 150 head of cattle (Bovine), are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the Lazaretto.
- 6. The importation of cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, Roumelia and Algeria not otherwise prohibited, may be permitted, subject to the undermentioned conditions: provided that, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, such cattle are not affected with disease so that they may be admitted in the Lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the Island:
- (a) Cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, and Roumelia shall only be admitted to the enclosures which may be assigned or approved for that purpose at the Lazaretto, and they shall be subjected to isolation and observation for 3 months, and those from Algeria for 15 days.
- (b) Application must be made for leave to import, and permission is to be obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment, stating the approximate number of the animals intended to be shipped. No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from Government and agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established.
- (c.) The application referred to in the preceding Article shall imply that the applicant has consented to pay the usual fees for entrance into the lazaretto and for guards and extraordinary expenses on each head of cattle, besides 2s. 6d. on each head of cattle per month or part thereof, in cases in which it is found necessary to keep cattle in the lazaretto for a longer period than 15 days.

(d.) That such cattle, if slaughtered at the lazaretto, will be subject to the regulations which may from time to time be made by the Port Authorities.

(e.) The owners of cattle in the lazaretto shall be subjected to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from

time to time be made by the Port Authorities. The importation, however, of horses, mules, and asses from Odessa is prohibited.

7. Swine arriving from Albania and Greece may be imported, subject to twenty days' quarantine at the lazaretto or in private pens, and to any restrictions which the Chief Government Medical Officer may consider necessary

8. The importation of dogs is subjected to three months' quarantine.

Sir E. Monson to Consul Perceval, Paris, March 14, 1897.

Ascertain immediately and telegraph under what conditions steamers will now be allowed to discharge Bombay and Karachi cargo at Marseilles, and whether they will be allowed to discharge in quarantine, or if not, how many days' quarantine they must undergo before entering harbour and discharging.

What are the regulations as to passengers.

Will steamers having cargo interdicted in France for English ports be allowed to discharge other cargo at Marseilles. The above points are not clear under Decree of March 9th.

No. 149.—FRANCE—WEST COAST. Alteration in Ile de Sein Light.

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 672 of 1896 and 27 of 1897:-

The French Government has given further notice that, on 10th March, 1897, Ile de Sein Light would be altered from a fixed and flashing red and white light to a group-flashing white light with a period of twenty-five seconds, thus—flash a tenth of a second, eclipse three seconds, flash a tenth of a second, eclipse three seconds, flash a tenth of a second, eclipse three seconds, flash a tenth of a second, eclipse fifteen and a half seconds; the sector of red light, visible from S. 65° W. to N. 84° W., has been discontinued.
