NOTICE is hereby given, that The Queen's Birthday will be celebrated in London alone on Wednesday, the 26th of May next, and at all other Stations, Naval and Military, on Monday, the 24th of May next.

Foreign Office, March 29, 1897.

THE Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a telegram from Her Majesty's Minister at Tokio reporting that a Law has been promulgated in Japan for the introduction of a Gold Standard.

The principal provisions of the Law are reported by Her Majesty's Minister to be as follows:

The unit of value is the gold dollar weighing :75 grammes, exactly half of the gold dollar of 1871. Coins will be five, ten, and twenty dollar pieces,-nine hundred fine.

The present silver dollar remains legal tender until six months after notice of its withdrawal shall have been given. It will be gradually exchanged for gold coin at par within five years of such notice. The ratio works out at 1 to 32.348. Subsidiary silver coins,—half-dollar, twenty, and ten cents, eight hundred fine as before. The Mint will be closed to the coinage of silver and open to gold from date of promulgation -March 29-from which date also the coinage of the silver one yen ceases. The rest of the Law will come into operation from October 1.

(Note.—It is understood that '75 grammes represents the fine content of the new gold dollar, and that its actual weight-900 fine-will be 0.83 grammes.)

WHEREAS by "The Wild Birds Protection Act," 1880, the killing or taking of any kind of Wild Bird during the period between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year was prohibited:

And whereas, by an order of the Secretary of State, dated the 15th day of February, 1896, this period was extended so far as concerns the county of London, so as to commence on the 1st day of February and end on the 31st day of August

in every year:
... Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896," and for special reasons which have been placed before me in an application from the County Council for the Administrative County of London, do hereby make the following Order :-

During the period from the 1st of September in any year to the 31st January following, the taking or killing of any of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Wood-peckers, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls, Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit, Reedling or Reed Pheasant, Shrikes, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Red Start, Fly Catchers, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Black Cap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiff Chaff, White Throat, Lesser White Throat, Long Tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wagtails (4), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (3), Starling, Landrail or Cornerake, Coot, and Chaffinch.
