And that upon the required consent being given, Judgment may be entered against the bankrupt by the Trustee in the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice for the said sum of £800, together with £1 10s. for costs of Judgment	Bankrupt's assets are not of a value equal to 10s. in the pound on the amount of his unsecured liabilities; and that he had on a previous occasion made an arrangement with his creditors
