(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 dated the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-seven.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Rate Receipt Check Book and Demand Note: Prescribing Forms:-

To the Overseers of the Poor of every Parish in England and Wales in which is comprised Agricultural Land as defined by the Agricultural Rates Act, 1896;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General and other Orders issued by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and by Us, the Local Government Board, provision was made with regard to the form of the Rate Receipt Check Book, and of the Demand Note for the payment of any Poor Rate :

And whereas in order to meet the requirements of the Agricultural Rates Act, 1896, it is expedient that, as regards every Parish comprising Agricultural Land as defined by that Act, other Forms should be prescribed for the Rate Receipt Check Book and for the Demand Note to be printed therein:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows with regard to every Parish in England and Wales in which is comprised Agricultural Land as defined by the Agricultural Rates Act. 1896, and in which a Rate Receipt Check Book shall be in use; that is to say:-

I .- From and after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyeight, or where the Overseers of the Poor so direct, from and after the date hereof, the Rate Receipt Check Book and the Demand Note to be printed therein shall, subject to any departure which may be assented to by Us, be in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order:

Provided that in the Demand Note the words "Amount payable by Owner, provided it be paid within the time prescribed by Section 5 of the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869," and in the Receipt and Counterfoil the words per cent." and " Allowance to Owner at "Received from Owner" may be omitted in any case where such words are not required, and it shall not be necessary to include in the Demand Note a reference to expenses other than those in respect of which the rate was made:

Provided also that in the Demand Note the purposes for which the Rate was made may, if the Overseer so direct, be printed on the back of the Demand Note, subject to the following con-

ditions; namely:—
(1.) The words "See back for particulars of Rate" must be printed in bold type at the bottom of the front page.

(2.) The words "(Signed) "Collector or Assistant Overseer" must be inserted on the front page immediately above the words mentioned in con-

(3.) The words "Purposes for which the Rate mentioned on the other side" must be substituted for the words "Purposes for which the above-mentioned Rate."

II.—In any Parish comprising Agricultural Land as defined by the Agricultural Rates Act, 1896, in which a Demand Note without a Rate Receipt Check Book shall be in use, the above provisions, so far as they refer to the Demand Note, shall apply.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 15TH APRIL 1897.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Order of the Board dated the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyseven prohibiting the holding of markets and fairs and of public and other sales or exhibitions of swine, fat or store, within the parishes of St. Clears and Llanfihangel-Aber-Cowin in the county of Carmarthen, shall be read and have effect as if the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven were substituted for the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven in Article 3 of that Order, as the date upon which that Order shall come into operation.

NOTICES TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 201 to 213 of the year 1897.) [The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward. No. 201.—ICE IN SOUTHERN INDIAN OCEAN.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 722 of 1896:

Mariners are again warned that icebergs are still being reported in unusual numbers in comparatively low latitudes in the Southern Indian Ocean between the meridians of 40° E. and 84° E., thus :-

1. On 10th January, 1897, the Dutch barque "Concordia" passed icebergs between lats. 42° S. and 43° S., and longs. 46° E. and 48° E.

2. The steam-vessel "Kaikoura," from 10th to 16th January, 1897, between lats. 45° S. to 48° S., longs. 42° E. to 80° E., passed many icebergs, especially in about lat. 48° S., longs. 59° E. to 65° E.

3. The steam-vessel "Port Chalmers," from 18th to about 18th January, 1897, between lats. 44° S. and 46° S., and longs. 45° E. and 75° E., passed many bergs, much broken up in appearance.

4. The steam-vessel "Hubbuck," from 17th to | notice that, on or about 3rd April, 1897, the

22nd January, 1897, between lats 45° S. to 47° S., longs 40° E. to 74° E., passed icebergs, one in the last-mentioned longitude about 5 miles long.

5. The steam-vessel, "Gulf of Lions," from 12th to 18th January, 1897, between lats. 44° S. to 47° S., longs. 41° E. to 80° E., passed many

icebergs, some said to be 400 feet in height.
6. The steam-vessel "Cornwall," on 28th January, 1897, passed icebergs in lat. 41° S., longs. 52° to 53° E.

7. The steam-vessel "Nairnshire," from 8th to about 18th February, 1897, between lats. 43° S. and 47° S., longs. 45° E. to 84° E., passed many icebergs; and during a fog on the 8th February was in collision with a low berg.

As: it is not likely that ice in such unusual quantities will quickly disappear, the seaman is cautioned that the route recommended in the Admiralty Book of Ocean Passages, 1896, pages 138, 139, should be followed; and particular attention is directed to the reason on page 139 for not recommending a higher parallel than 40° S.

INFORMATION has been received from Her Britannic Majesty's Consul at Tahiti that the Master of the French barque "President Thiers" reports that, on 8th January, 1897, he obtained soundings of 19 to 21 fathoms on a bank, composed of broken coral and shells, extending about 6 miles in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, with discoloured water some distance from it, and 16 fathoms on its edge.

This bank, now named President Thiers, has been placed on the Admiralty Chart in latitude 24° 39' S., longitude 145° 51' W. (the position given), with a depth of 16 fathoms marked on it.
