THE Netherlands Government has given notice that, on 15th May, 1897, a light would be exhibited from the South Mole Head, Westkapelle :-

Westkapelle South Mole Head Light is a sixth order, dioptric, fixed light, showing the following sectors :- red from south to the shore to the eastward ; white from south, through east, to N. 56° E.; green from N. 56° E. (over No. 1 East Gat Buoy), through north, to N. 7° W. (over No. 2 East Gat Buoy); and white from N. 7° W. to the shore to the eastward.

In clear weather the white light is visible six miles, the red light four miles, and the green three miles.

The light is shown from a pole, with a square yellow house at its base, standing on brown posts, the whole 28 feet in height, and situated with Westkapelle Principal Lighthouse bearing about N. 82° E., distant ℓ_{\pm}^{\pm} cables; or approximately in lat. 51° 31′ 35″ N.; long. 3° 26′ 0″ E.
