THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Decree published by the Swiss Government respecting quarantine, viz.:-

Arrêté du Conseil fédéral concernant l'entrée et le trangit de certains objets et marchandises provenant de circonscriptions contaminées par la peste.
(Du 11 mai 1897.)
Le Couseil fédéral suisse, en application de l'article 7 , alinéa 1 , de la loi fédérale du 2 juillet 1886 concernant les mesures à preudre contre les épidémies offrant un danger général, et en abrogation de l'arrêté fédéral du 29 janvier 1897 concernant l'importation et le transit de certains objets et marchandises provenant des Indes anglaises, arrêté :-

Arr. 1er. List interdite, jusqu'à nouvel avis, l'entréc en Suisse des marchandises et objets suirants, pour autant qu'ils proviennent, directement ou indirectement, d'une circonscription contaminée par la peste.
a. Linge de corps et vêtements portés (effets à usage), literie ayant seri. Lorsque ces objets sont transportés comme bagages ou à la suite d'un changement de domicile (effets d'installation), ils sont soumis aux dispositions des articles 3 et 4.
b. Chiffons et drilles de tonte espèce.
c. Sacs usés, vieux tapis, broderies ayant servi, plumes à lit ayant servi. .
d. Cuirs et peaux bruts, à l'exception des peaux complétement séchées (traitées à l'arsenic).
e. Débris frais (bruts) d'animaux, vessies et boyaux, onglons, sabots, cornes brutes, crins, soies et laines brutes.

## $f$. Cheveux.

Art. 2. Le transit des objets et marchandises mentionnés à l'article 1 est égàlement interdit, s'ils ne sont pas emballés de telle façon qu'ils ne puissent être toụchés ni manipulés en route.

Art. 3. Si les objets'mentionnés à l'article 1 ,
lettre $a$, provenant de circouscriptions contaminées par la peste, sont transportés comme bagages (y compris les menus bagages), ils doivent être soumis, à la station d'entrée en Suisse ou au lieu de destination, à une inspection sanitaire de la part des autorités sanitaires locales, et si celles-ci le jugent nécessaire, à une désinfection.
Art. 4. Les effets personnels expédiés par grande ou par petite vitesse, ainsi que les objets transportés par suite d'un changement de domicile (effets d'installation) ne peuvent pénétrer en Suisse (qu'ils soient à destination de la Suisse ou qu'il s'agisse d'un̆ simịle' transit) qu'aux stãtions douanières de Chiasso-gare, le Genève (gare de Cornavin), de Vailorbes, des Verrières, du Locle, de Porrentruy, de Bâle (gare du Central et gare badöise), 'dé-Schaffhouse, de Romanshorn, de Rorschach et de Buchs.

Dès l'arrivée d'un envoi de ce genre, provenant d'une circonscription reconnue contaminée, les autorités douanières en informent, par l'intermédiaire de l'autoritè communale, les autorités sanitaires locales; celles-ci font procéder sans retard à l'inspection sanitaire de l'envoi, et, si elles le jugent nécessaire, à sa désinfection.

Art. 5. La désinfection se fera d'après les sègles renfermées dans les "Instructions relatives à la désinfection en temps de choléra," du 28 juillet 1893.

Art. 6. Jusqu’il nouvel avis sont considérés comme contaninés par la peste les provinces de Bombay et du Sindh (Indes anglaises), les possessious portugaises de Goa (Inde) et le sud-ouest de la Chinc. Les dispositions ci-dessus concernant l'entrée et le transit de certains objets et marchandises (articles 1 à 4) s'appliquent donc aux provenances des ports de Bombay, Karatschi (Kurachee) et Goa (Inde), ainsi qu'aे celles de Macao, de Hong-Kong, de Cantun, de Swatow, d'Amoy et de l'île Formose (Chine).

Mais comme les contrées voisines des régions contuminées doirent, en une certaine mesure, être considérées comme suspectes, les dispositions des articles 1 à 4 , sont également applicables aux provenances de tout le reste de l'Inde, à celle du Beloutschistan, des ports du golfe Persique et de la Chine, à moins qu'il ne puisse être établi d'une manière certaine pour chaque envoi, soit parl'attestation d'un consulat, soit par celle des autorités du lieu de provenance ou du port de départ, que l'envoi provient d'une région où la peste ne règne pas, et que le port de départ n'est pas contaminé, ou tout au moins qu'il ne l'était pas an moment où le navire a pris la mer.

Art. 11. Pour tout envoi arrivé par un port européen et contenant des objets ou marchandises mentionnées al l'article 1er, il doit être préaenté aux autorités douanières un certificat d'origine dressé d'après les papiers du navire par les autorités compétentes du port d'arrivée.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Quarantine Notice, issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :-

Government Notice.
His Excellency the Governor having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased
to modify Government Notice No. 90 of 5th May, 1897, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :-

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate in quarantine with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the Collector of Customs may direct.
(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage, cases of cholera, yellow fever or. plague or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera, yellow fever or plague.
(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.
(c.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Saic.
2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal and take in provisions under quarantine restrictions.
(a.) Vessels arriving from Bombay and Kurrachee.
(b.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health which do not fall under any of the preceding regulations.

## 3. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

## 4. Passengers.

Passengers arriving from Mediterranean ports must, before landing, declare on outh that they have not been in Bombay or Kurrachee within the last 30 days. All passengers who have been within the last 30 days in Bombay or Kurrachee shall be landed at the Lazaretto and remain there, under such restrictions as may be ordered by the Port Authority, for a period not less than seven days from date of disinfection and not less than the number of days required to complete 30 days from the date of departure.
5. Goods.

The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

The importati $\cdot \mathrm{n}$ of rays is prohibited.
The inportation is forbidden before disinfection, of the following articler, viz., wearing apparel; soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials, hides, feathers, bones and jute goods.
The importation of vines, vine shoots, and fruit packed in vine leaves is prohibited. The importation of plants or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate that phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

THE Board of Trade have receised, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Alfairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclusing the following copies of Ordinances reapecting Quarantine issued by the Italinu Govermment, viz. :-
('Translation.)
Ministry of the Interior, 1897. Maritime Sanitary Notice, No. 3.
The Minister of the Interior-
Scen the law for the protection of public hygiene and heulth (sections 49 and 50) and to
the Maritime Sanitary Notices of December 29th, 1896, No. 4, and Jंanuary 14th, 1897, No. 1.

Seen the International Sanitary Convention concluded at Venice on the 18th March, 1897.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to place the proposals made at the said Conference in harmony with the sanitary measures intended to prevent the importation of plague into the Kingdom.

Having heard the Superior Board of Health, bercby decrees-
Sec. 1. All vessels coming from ports infected with plaguc, or lelonging. to districts or boundaries embracing plague-stricken places, before being admitted to free pratique in the Kingdom, will have to undergo a medical inspection of the persons on board, and to the disinfection of their soiled wearing apparel or other effects. The sink water on board, after disinfection, is to be ejected, and the water supply is to be substituted by pure drinkable water.'

The following rules will also have to be ohserved:-.

1st. Vessels provided with a medical officer and with a disinfecting apparatus will be admitted to free pratique, provided such medical officer will declare upon oath :-
(a.) That no wearing apparel or otlier domestic effects or luggage were received on looard-without having been previously disinfected, or that the said articles were properly disinfected on board;
(b.) That neither at the time of sailing, nor during the voyage, did any actual or suspected cases of plague occur on board.

2ud. Vessels having on board a medical officer, but not provided with a disinfecting apparatus, will be admitted to free pratique, provided it will result from a sworn declarition of the medical officer :-
(a.) That no wearing apparel or other effects, nor luggage, were-shipped without previous disinfection ;
(b.) That neither at the time of sailing, nor during the voyage, did any actual-or suspected cases of the disease occur on board.
3rd. Vessels which are not provided with a medical officer, nor with a disinfecting apparatus, but which were free from disease during the voyage, will be admitted to free pratique after laving gone through the treatment set forth in the first paragraph of this section, as well as after having undergone all such other precautionary measures as the sanitary authorities may deem expedient to order, in special cases, so as to make sure of the healthy condition of the vessel.

Sec. 2. Vessels on which either at the time of sailing, or during the voyage, actual or suspected cases of plague have occurred, can be admitted to free pratique subsequent to the carrying out of all the measures set forth in section 1, paragraph 1, and provided the fullowing conditions are observed:-

1 st . In the case of yessels having a medical officer and a disinfecting apparatus, free pratique will be granted if such medical officer will declare on oath that at lenst twelve days have elapsed since the death or complete recovery of any stricken person on board ; and that the effects and articles belonging to the persons so stricken, the persons who attended upon them, and the cabins in which the sick persons were laid up, have been disinfected.

2nd. In the case of ressels which are provided with a medical officer, but not with a disinfecting apparatus, they will be admitted to free pratique provided such medical officer will, upon oath, declare that fourteen days at least have elapsed from the date of death or complets recorcry of the strieken persons, and that the cinuical dis.
infections mentioned in the preceding paragraph have been carried out.

3rd. In the case of ressels not provided with a medical officer, nor with a disinfecting apparatus, but which may have had on board suspected or actual cases of plague, even before fourteen days, will not be admitted to free pratique till after such vessels are ordered off to a Quarantine Station, and kept there for such period of time as may be deemed necessary for their disinfection and to make sure that they have been restored to a healthy condition.

Sxc. 3. Vessels which at the time of their arrival have on board ascertained or suspected cases of plague, or which may have had such cases since less than twelve days will, none excepted, be ordered off to a Quarantine Station where they shall undergo such treatment as wiil in each case be prescribed by the Ministry of the Interior.

Sec. 4. The importation, either direct or indirect, of the following goods from plague-stricken places is forbidden :-
(a.) Worn wearing apparel or other domestic effects carried as wholesale merchandise ;
(b.) Rags, even if compressed by hydraulic power and carried as bale merchandise ;
(c.) Raw, fresh, or dry hides;
(d.) Raw portions of animals, nails, hoofs, bristles, hair, raw wool ;
(e.) Hair.

The prohibition mentioned in this section will be extended to goods of a similar description, although originating from other countries, in all cases when their transport was effected on vessels which may have at infected ports, excepting in cases when such goods shall have been placed in special holds apart from the goods, importation whereof is forbidden, shipped at the same ports.

Sec. 5. All goods specified in Section 4, originating from a healthy harbour belonging to a State where the plague-stricken districts are placed, will have to be accompanied with a medical certificate and a certificate of origin, issued by the competent local authorities and viséd by the Italian Consul or Consular Agent within whose jurisdiction the place of shipment is situate.

Sec. 6. Medical inspections to ships are to take place during day time.

Sec. 7. The sanitary mcasures set forth in the present notice will be applied at the first port of call, excepting in special cases. At the subsequent ports of call, provided nothing abnormal occurs during the voyage after the first port of call, the sanitary measures will be limited to a general medical inspection of all persons on board and to the sole disinfection of the effects intended to be landed.

With regard to the ordering off of vessels, when necessary, to the quarantine stations, for the present they will be all sent to the Asinara Station ; but should the opportunity arise another station will be appointed.

Src. 8. Notices dated 29th December, 1896, No. 4, and 14th January, 1897, No. 1, are cancelled.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces and the Harbour Authorities are directed to carry out the objects of the present notice.

1897.-Maritime Sanitary Notice No. 4. Whereas by Maritime Sanitary Notice of this
date, No. 3, several provisions were adopted relating to the sanitary measures against the plague;

Pursuant to the Law of the $\varepsilon 2$ nd December, 1888, No. 5849 (3rd series);

The Minister of the Interior -
Decrees:
For the purpose of section 1 of the said notice the ports situate on the coast between the frontier of Hindostan with Beluchistan and the Portuguese Possessions of Goa are declared infected with the plague.

Sec. 2. The prohibition of importing goods mentioned in section 4 of the said notice is applicable to the ports specified in the preceding section as well as to all the countries and districts belonging to the Presidency of Bombay.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces and the Harbour Authorities of the Kingdom are directed to carry out the object of the present notice.

## NOTICE TO STAMP DEALERS AND THE PUBLIC.

 Imitations of Postage Stamps.THE Postmaster-General and the Commissioners of Inland Revenue direct attention to the case of Dickins v. Gill, reported in the Law Reports (1896) 2 Q.B. 311. This was a special case stated by Sir John Bridge, Chief Magistrate of the Metropolis, by way of Appeal from a Judgment given by him upon a prosecution for jecovery of the penalty imposed by section 7 of the Post Office Protection Aét, $1884^{\circ}$ ( 47 and 48 Vict. c. 76).
. The section is as follows:-
"A person shall not-
" (a) Make, knowingly utter, deal in or sell "any fictitious stamp, or knowingly use for " any postal purpose any fictitious stamp ; or
" (b) Have in his possession, unless he shows a "S lawful excuse, any fictitious stamp; or
" (c) Make, or, unless he shows a lawful excuse, "have in his possession, any die, plate, in-
"strument, or materials for making any " fictitious stamp.
"Any person who acts in contravention of this "r section shall bn liable on summary conviction " on a prosecution, by order of the Commissioners
" of Inland Revenue, to a fine not exceeding. $£ 20$,
"s subject to the like right of appeal as in the case
" of a penalty under the Acts relating to the
"Excise.
"Any stamp, die, plate, instrument, or mate"rials found in the possession of any person in "contravention of this section may be seized and " shall be forfeited.
"For the purposes of this section 'fictitious "'stanp' means any facsimile or imitation or © representation, whether on paper or otherwise, "i of any stamp for denoting any rate of postage, " including any stamp for denoting a rafe of post-
" age of any of Her Majesty's colonies, or of any " foreign country."
The facts relating to the prosecution were as under:-
The proprietor of a newspaper circulating among stamp-collectors and others caused a die to be made for him abroad, from which imitations or representations of a current colonial postage stamp could be produced. The only purpose for which the die was ordered by him, and was subsequently kept it his possession, was for making upon the pages of an illustrated stamp catalogue, called "The Philatelist's Supplement," illustrations in black and white and not in colours of the colonial stamp in question, this special supplement bèing intended for sale as part of his newspaper.

The Court held that the possession of a die for making a false stamp, known to be such to its possessor, was, however innocent the use that he intended to make of it, a possession without lawful excuse within the meaning of the above section.

It is obvious, therefore, that the possession of dies from which representations of postage stamps can be produced and the issue of representations of stamps produced from dies of this description are contraventions of the section above mentioned, and all persons are cautioned accordingly.

WHEREAS by my Order, dated the oth day of June, 1896, 1 ordered that the time during which the taking and killing of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Suffolk should be extended so as to be from the 1st March to the 1st September, in each year :

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by Steamship Wilhelmin:-

1. It shall not be lawful during the continuance of this Order for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any aninals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamship Wilhelmina, owned by the Noord Europa Steam Ship Company, Rotterdam, and such conreyance of animals by that vessel is hereby prohibited accordingly.

## Offences.

2. If an animal is conveyed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## Interpretation.

3. In this Order-
"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:
"Master" includes a person having the charge or command of the vessel :
Other terms lave the same meaning as in the Act of 1894 .

Commencement and Duration.
4. This Urder shall cope into operation on the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and shall cease to operate from and immediately after the ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
