PURSUANT to an Order of the High Court of Justice Chancery Division made in the Matter of Ex parte the Undertaking of the South Yorkshire Junction Railway Bill Session 1890 and in the Matter of the South Yorkshire Junction Railway Act 1890 (53 and 54 Victoria chapter 213) and in the Matter of the South Yorkshire Junction Railway Act 1897 and in the Matter of the Act 9 and 10 Victoria chapter 20 1897 S. No. 1459. Any landowners or other persons whose property has been interfered with or otherwise rendered less valuable by the com-

mencement construction or abandonment of the Railways Nos. 6, 7, 8 and 9 authorized by the said South Yorkshire Junction Railway Act 1890 or any portion thereof being railways situate in the West Riding of the county of York commencing in the township and parish of Sprotbrough at a point at or about the centre of Spring-lane six hundred and twenty yards or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction along the said lane from the south end thereof and passing through the township of Balby-with-Hexthorpe in the parish of Doncaster and terminating in the township
