BY an Order made by Mr. Justice Vaughan Williams in the above matters dated the 28th May 1897 on the petition of Thomas George Stevens of No. 5 the Terrace Greenhithe in the county of Kent Engineer a creditor and contributory of the above-named Company it was ordered that the voluntary winding-up of the said Stevens Cask and Barrel Company Limited be continued but subject to the supervision of the Court and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up might be adopted as the Court should think fit. And the creditors contributories and Liquidator of the said Company and all other persons interested were to be at liberty to apply to the Court as there might be occasion. And it was ordered that the costs of
