In the High Court of Justice.—Companies
(Winding-up).

Mr. Justice Vaughan Williams.
No. 00117 of 1897.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts 1862 to
1890 and in the Matter of the South Swazie-
land Gold and Exploration Company Limited.

BY an Order made in the above matters by Mr.
Justice Vaughan Williams dated Monday
the 28th day of May 1897 on the petition of
Joseph Bedford Foster of No. 61 King William-
street in the city of London a shareholder of the
above-named Company it was ordered that the
voluntary winding-up of the said South Swazie-
land Gold and Exploration Company should be
continued but subject to the supervision of the
Court and that any of the proceedings under the said
voluntary winding-up might be adopted as the
Court should think fit. And it was ordered that

Charles Walter Grimwade the Liquidator in the
voluntary winding-up of the said Company should
on the 28th June next and on the same day in
each succeeding month file with the Registrar of
Companies (Winding-up) a report in writing as to
the position of and the progress made with the
winding-up of the said Company and with the
realization of the assets thereof and as to any other
matters connected with the winding-up as the
Court might from time to time direct. And it
was ordered that no bills of costs charges or
expenses or special remuneration of any Solicitor
employed by the Liquidator of the said Company
or any remuneration charges or expenses of such
Liquidator or of any Manager Accountant
Auctioneer Broker or other person should be paid
out of the assets of the said Company unless such
costs charges expenses or remuneration should
have been taxed or allowed by the Registrar of
