## ORDER OF THE STAR OF INDIA.

*India Office, June 28, 1897.*

IT had been the Queen's intention to confer a Companionship of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India on the late Mr. Robert Blair McCabe, Indian Civil Service, in recognition of his services in Assam, and of his work of exceptional merit among the wild tribes of the North-East Frontier of India.

THE Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. Albert Edward Evans to superintend the transfer of Lascars, or other persons, at Avonmouth, and to grant the Certificate required under Section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic., cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every Lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such Certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

### THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1894.

#### WYRLEY WAKE FAIR.

THE Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, that by Memorial, dated the 27th day of May, 1897, a representation has been duly made to him by the Rural District Council of Cannock, that a Fair has been annually held on the Monday on or nearest to the 26th of October in each year, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should in future be held on the 1st Monday in August in each year.

On the 24th day of July, 1897, the Secretary of State will take such representation into consideration, and any person who may desire to object to the alteration of the date for holding the Fair, should intimate his objections to the Secretary of State before that day.
